

In a blaze of light you wandered off to find where demons dwell."





Isaiah 43: 1-7

But now thus says the LORD, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name; you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you, and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you.

For I am the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior. I give Egypt as your ransom, Cush and Seba in exchange for you.

Because you are precious in my sight and honored and I love you, I give people in return for you, nations in exchange for your life.

Do not fear, for I am with you; I will bring your offspring from the east, and from the west I will gather you; I will say to the north, "Give them up," and to the south, "Do not withhold; bring my sons from far away and my daughters from the end of the earth-- everyone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made."

Acts 8:14-17

Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them. The two went down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit (for as yet the Spirit had not come upon any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus). Then Peter and John laid their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

As the people were filled with expectation and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water, but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the strap of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

Now when all the people were baptized and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."

LITURGY - REMEMBRANCE OF OUR BAPTISMS

We gather today to worship and praise the God of awe and majesty. We come to encounter the God who knows us each by name and who walks with us in intimate love. We come to reaffirm the blessing we have received through our baptism. In baptism, we remember God's saving actions throughout history, and we have the opportunity to answer yes as God whispers our names. As a community of God, we gather today at the waters of baptism to reaffirm our commitment to Christ and to experience anew the transforming power of the Holy Spirit.

Pastoral prayer of sanctification of the water

O God, we rejoice in your grace, given and received.

We thank you that you claim us,

that you wash us, strengthen us, and guide us,

that you empower us to live a life worthy of our calling.

Bless this water, make it holy, to be a sign and a blessing unto us.

In the way of Jesus, make us as holy water in a dry and thirsty world.

Establish us to be places of refreshment.

Root us and nurture us in love, that with all your people,

that we may rightly and justly serve you.

Fill us with your fullness, that our lives may overflow

in service and love. Amen.

REAFFIRMATION OF BAPTISM

Invitation (Pastor): If you choose, you may come forward to recall the promises of your baptism— made either by you or on your behalf by your parents or guardians. Please come forward to the font and as you touch your forehead with the water, say, "I am God's Beloved!"

Response (Each person): "I am God's beloved!"

In renewing your baptismal vows, remember your Baptism as a mark of acceptance and welcome into the care of Christ's church.

Here you may begin again your Christian faith and life.

(If you have never been baptized, consider whether this is the day you would like to take that step. If you choose to do so, you may be baptized today!)

Unison Prayer of Commitment (Matthew 3:13-17, Mark 1:9-11, Luke 3:21-23)

Loving Father, you anointed Jesus at his baptism with the Holy Spirit, and revealed him as your dear Son. Thank you for making us your children by water and the Spirit. Keep us faithful to you throughout our lives. We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen

Hear the words of our creator, spoken through the prophet Isaiah: "I have called you by name. You are mine.

Do not fear, for I have redeemed you."

4 Soon we'll reach the shining river, soon our pilgrimage will cease; soon our happy hearts will quiver with the melody of peace. [Refrain]


