Ontario: The Model Colony

Ontario was founded by the Chaffey brothers, George and William, in the fall of 1882. The brothers named their Model Colony after their home province, Ontario, Canada. Ontario means "the city on the side of a mountain."


The Chaffey brothers purchased approximately ten thousand acres to be divided into ten acre farm lots. A two hundred foot wide avenue with a parkway in the center extended from the Southern Pacific Railroad to the base of the mountains. George Chaffey named this avenue Euclid, after the mathematician.

To attract people to Ontario, the availability of water was proven by having a fountain by the train tracks. At one time it was someone's duty to turn the fountain on before the train arrived and shut it off after the train left the station. According to the news report in the "Ontario Fruit Grower." Ontario's first newspaper, seventy-five trains passed through Ontario in one week. Thus travelers saw water with their own eyes and The Model Colony grew.

History of Bethel Congregational Church

Bethel Congregational Church was the second church to be organized in The Model Colony. The first steps for the establishment of a formal organization were held February 2, 1885 in the home of Mrs. Joseph Waddingham. The Rev. J. T. Ford, the Superintendent of Home Missions presided. Fourteen persons signified their intentions of becoming members of the Church, and forms of the Confession of Faith and Convenant were considered. These forms, with some slight amendments and additions, were adopted one week later at the home of Joseph G. Moore. Rev. J.D. Foster of San Bernardino acted as the moderator. The charter members were:

Then, on March 22, 1885 the Council of Recognition convened. The charter members entered into a covenant as a church of Christ and became Bethel Congregational Church of Ontario.

Services were held in private residences and in the L. M. Holt Adobe until funds could be collected for a church building. In 1887 land was purchased at the corner of Palm Avenue and West "A" Street (now Holt Boulevard). On March 5, 1888 the church occupied the first building of its own. In 1893 the building was enlarged, beautiful memorial windows were added, and the church was re-dedicated.

In 1911 the lot at the corner of Euclid and "F" Street was purchased for \$5,000 and a building committee was formed. The estimated cost was \$10,000 for the church edifice if split stone was used (\$3,500 less if brick was used.) During the annual meeting on January 11, 1912 were the informal exercise for the cornerstone laying of the new church.

This structure is now the oldest church building in use in Ontario. Nomination has been made to the State to recognize Bethel Congregational Church as a Historical Landmark.

Recreation for early members of Bethel included hiking into San Antonio Canyon to Camp Larkin. An excerpt from W. E. Dean's journal from August 24, 1916 read: "Went up the canyon with twenty-five Congregational people to select camp site. Hot and sultry, light rain." There were additional notations of other jobs performed at the camp during the next three months as seen in this entry from November 13, 1916: "Hauled load of lime and cement to Camp Larkin. Very windy and cold." Many groups hiked to the church cabin until the flood of 1938 washed all traces of Camp Larkin away. Camp Larkin about 1930 Taken by Leo Eckart



Various women's and men's groups have been formed over the years. Ladies Aid has become three church guilds, the Cherubs, Pilgrim, and Scrooby-Leyden, all of which make up Women's Fellowship. The Fellowship is a very essential part of Bethel Church.

The choir has been very active over the years under the leadership of very talented and dedicated directors. S. Earle Blakeslee served as organist and choir director over twenty-five years. Mr. Blakeslee directed the first rendition of the Community Messiah in 1945.


The Harwood Memorial Organ was dedicated in 1930. The Pilcher Organ was custom made for Bethel Congregational Church. The factory assembled the organ, tested it in the factory, then disassembled for shipment to California in its own railroad car. The shipping weight was nearly nine tons.

Bethel Church has also been active in community sponsorships. In 1915 it helped with the establishment of Pilgrim Place in Claremont, a retirement community for ministers and other Christian workers. In 1921, Bethel sponsored the Chino Mexican Church. Presently, we sponsor Pilgrim Place. Pomona Valley Council of Churches, Peppermint Ridge, Friendship House, and Samaritan Center.

Today, Bethel is part of the United Church of Christ formed by the merger of the Evangelical and Reformed Church and the Congregational Churches. Bethel is associated with other congregations in the San Bernardino Association of the Southern California Conference of the United Church of Christ. In Bethel Congregational Church there is opportunity for worship, learning, growing, fellowship and service in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Milestones In The Life of Bethel Church

- 1885 March 22, Bethel Congregational Church formally recognized by the "The Congregational Council", there were 14 charter members. (W.B. Chaffey was the first signature on the Articles of Incorporation.)
- 1888 Frame building constructed on corner of "A" and Palm.
- 1910 September, site purchased on corner of "F" and Euclid for \$5,000.00 for new building.
- 1911 1912, New stone building constructed on site at cost of about \$40,000.00 (Brick would have cost \$3,500.00 less.)
- 1913 January 12-17, Dedication Services of new building, addresses by President James A. Blaisdale of Pomona College, Merton E. Hill of Chaffey Union High School and others.
- 1920 1929, Ordination and Sponsorship of Mrs. William Laidlaw who served in Narod Church, Ontario.
- 1921 Sponsorship of Chino Mexican Church by Bethel.
- 1957 The John Howes' Commissioned to Mexican Mission.
- 1958 May 1, James N. Cavener Ordination.
- 1961 April 30, Adoption of United Church of Christ Constitution.
- 1962 Completion and dedication of New Christian Education Wing, \$175,000.00 total (furnishings and building).
- 1962 May 22, Lloyd Fellows Ordination.
- 1963 June 23, David Reed Ordination.
- 1967 Dependency Prevention Commission, Day Care Center opens in Bethel Church.
- 1974 October 26, Dedication of the church ramp.
- 1976 Handbells were purchased and a handbell choir formed.
- 1980 November 23, Re-dedication of the restoration on the Harwood Memorial Organ.
- 1980 Re-roofed and painted the outside trim of the church. Members donated and loaned money for these projects.
- 1981 Re-paid all the loans in one year!
- 1984 -1985, Established the Heritage Room.




1917 Special Meeting


