- 2. Dues deadline and luncheon payment status Elaine Callahan, Ken Evens. No new dues payments. Elaine is still looking for picnic receipts from John Toensing.
- 3. 2024 "Thoughts from the Board": Ginger Banks will provide an article for the July newsletter article and Floyd Bard will do one for August. After that, Pat Harris will do September, Dick Kimbell October, Michael Pace November and Michael Kennedy will close out the year and his reign in December.
- 4. Continue discussion on the option of opening a second foundation fund with lower costs Dick Kimbell, Ken Evans, and Eric Watkins. Nothing more to do on this issue until our 501(c)3 is established. Evans and Watkins to confer. Could be done by November in time for members to do RMD gifts.
- 5. Eugene Mission Support Michael Kennedy. (see attached after action report): President Kennedy suggested we gage membership interest in participation in academic support or field trip leadership AFTER we see how chaplain led bible study meetings go. We should shoot for an additional program around September. Floyd Bard expressed a need for us to be seen supporting in the community rather than just delivering donations to increase MOAA visibility. Michael Pace will get a copy of the Mission's curriculum to see if we can build interest in the membership.
- 6. Discuss letter campaign to our congressional reps from this chapter, emphasis on MOAA's action items. This would prop up our involvement with that measured item in the LOE application. Ken Evans, Legislative Chair, will draft letter for President's signature.
- 7. Elected board members for 2025 Dick Norton says we are in pretty good shape for new President and new 1st Vice President. He still has a few board members to confirm their future plans.

June 8th Annual Picnic evaluation: Sundays in June are good. We do need a new person to run it in 2025.

1st Vice President Report: Personal Affairs and Surviving Spouse Liaison, House Committee, Newsletter, Website: Webmaster reports 68 hits on the website last month. BRIEFS AND BOOSTERS


