Board members: Jonathan Landon, Frank Balazs, Michael Pace, LTC Joe Snyder, Michael Kennedy and Tom Kulick. New member, Randy Clough, was also in attendance. A quorum was established.

NOTES:

- The 501(c)19 Columbia Checking Account is now closed. The remaining funds of \$1000.00 were transferred into the 501(c)3 Columbia checking account under Chapter Operations.
- The Bottle Drop Account currently stands at \$415.73, after \$1200 was moved from this account to the Columbia Account under Veterans Services.

OLD AND NEW BUSINESS

- 1. Donations to Veteran-Centric Non-Profit Organizations Floyd.
- A motion was made by Jonathan Landon to program the expenditure of 75 percent of the Veterans Service Fund each year to specific Veteran-Centric Non-Profit Organizations. The remaining 25 percent will be expended as needs arise.
- ♦ Dick Kimbell seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. An additional motion was made by Dick Kimbell to donate \$1200 to Honor Flight to fund a Sponsor. The motion was seconded by John Toensing and was passed unanimously.
- ◆ Discussion was held to fund (1) Housing Our Vets, (2) Quilts of Valor and (3) Dogs of Valor, in that order, with specific amounts to be decided at the next board meeting.
- 2. U of O ROTC Report LTC Snyder, PMS
- ♦ They have lost two staff members during the government shutdown and they've had to adjust some training to local facilities. Also, no cadets' stipends are being handed out.
- ♦ The annual chili cook-off will be held 5 December. Details to follow, but the PMS would like to see some MOAA entrees to compete with him for "Old Man Chili Champ.".
- ◆ The PMS plans to take some cadets with him to visit Dick and Barbara Heyman.
- 3. President Bard attended the 20 October MOAA Oregon Council of Chapters meeting by Zoom. CAPT Frank Michaels, Senior Director of MOAA's Affiliated Councils and Chapters spoke about chapter challenges with recruiting and national MOAA's challenges getting chaptermember support in the Legislative Action Center. The minutes of that meeting will be attached to this report.
- 4. The Soaring by the Sea Foundation at the Eugene airport now has an A-1E Skyraider and will be getting a UH-1H to restore soon.
- 5. The Lane County Stand Down decided to disperse their excess funds this year to veteransupporting organizations such as VFW, American Legion and MOAA. Their offer to us was to buy lunch for members and guests at our November 12th general membership meeting. Enjoy and say, "Thanks."

A little history from the Ducks game against Rutgers on Saturday, 18 Oct.

Just as the third quarter was getting ready to start, the two announcers got into a conversation about the lineage of the Ducks. It seems that before they were the Ducks they were known as the Webfoots, and that was also the name of the Massachusetts fishermen who helped get George Washington and his army across the Delaware River on Christmas night 1776. The Battle of Trenton turned out to be a key battle in the Revolutionary War. After the war, a lot of the decedents of those fishermen would move on to Oregon and settle in the Willamette Valley, and that's where the name Webfoots came from.

OUR OCTOBER SPEAKER

ur October speaker, Alan Ezelle, was as dynamic as BG Norm Hoffman said he would be. He explained that LCC's Maxwell Student Veteran Center is the hub for all veterans currently enrolled in LCC, helping them maximize their veterans' benefits and succeed in school. Alan explained that the center has doubled it's veteran enrollment since 2021, and is now serving 302 vets... about 5-6 percent of the student population.

Mr. Ezelle explained that the center is funded through LCC and

the Oregon Department of Veteran Affairs, with some support from organizations for disabled veteran. He and his staff do outreach to Lane County military units such as the Marines and Navy Reserves, the Army National Guard and the Coast Guard in Florence.

Alan noted that there are about 30,000 veterans living in Lane County; about ten percent of the population. Of that population, about 1,000 are currently serving in the military, with 250 on active duty.

Alan says that tours of the Maxwell Center are always available and that they are having a Veterans Day observance on 10 November between 1100-1300 at the Center (Building 1, Room 201), with a panel discussion on transitioning from the military to civilian life. The Center takes donations of shelf-stable foods that they can give to student veterans in need.
