
TOP TO BOTTOM

FIREFLY UPDATE

Work on the Firefly has progressed steadily under the capable hands of George Cummins, Bud Ayre, and John Webber. The fuselage has been completely stripped and found to be in excellent condition structurally, except for some minor corrosion in the tail area. The centre wing section is also sound and ready to be re-mated to the fuselage. It was too wide to fit the Hercules, so was removed prior to shipment from Eritrea.


The engine is now about 90% disassembled and, except for some superficial pitting on one cylinder wall, appears completely sound.







A search has begun to replace the laminated wood propeller, which did not survive 40+ years of brutal weather. The SAMF Spotters Club would appreciate hearing from all members with information, even hearsay info, or suggestions as to where a Firefly prop, wood or metal, might be located.



John Webber, our senior restoration engineer, sees no technical reason why PP462 cannot be made flyable. As the work advances, John has arranged for several civilian students from a local aviation trades school to obtain supervised hands-on experience with non-critical airframe components.
