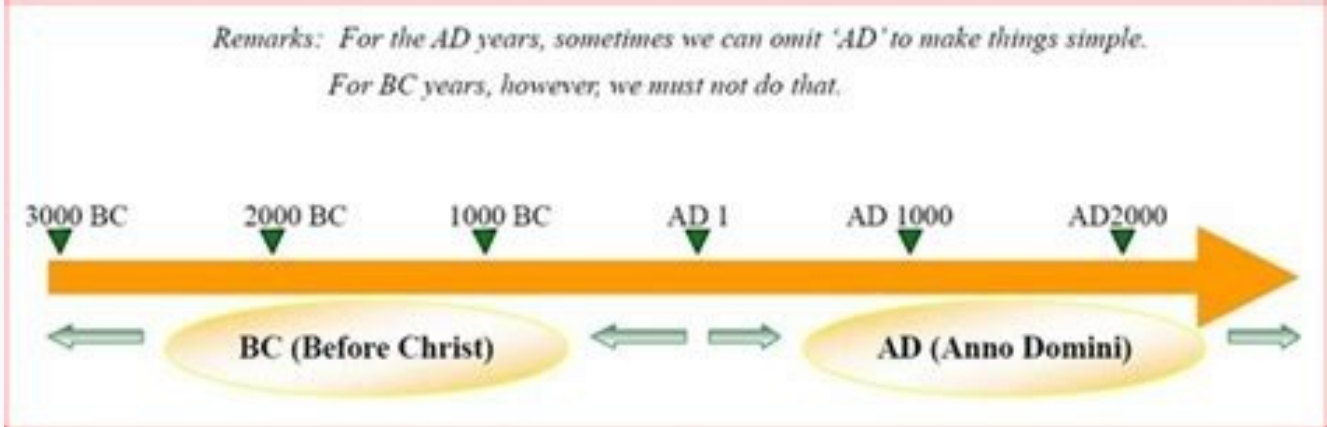

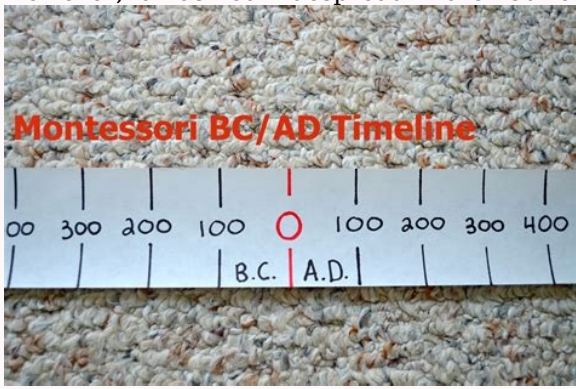
## How does bc and ad work on a timeline

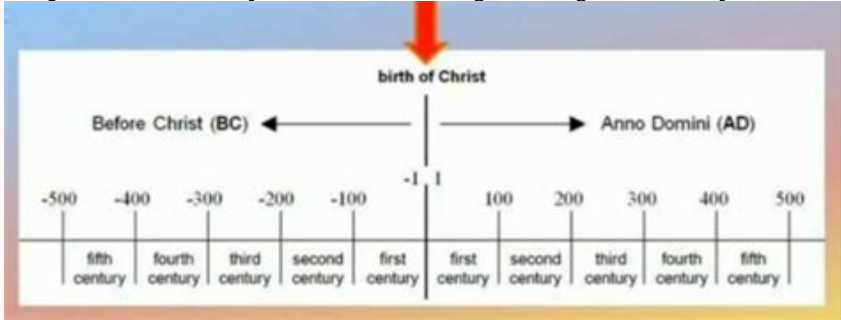

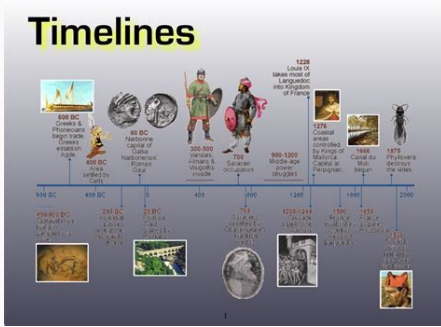
