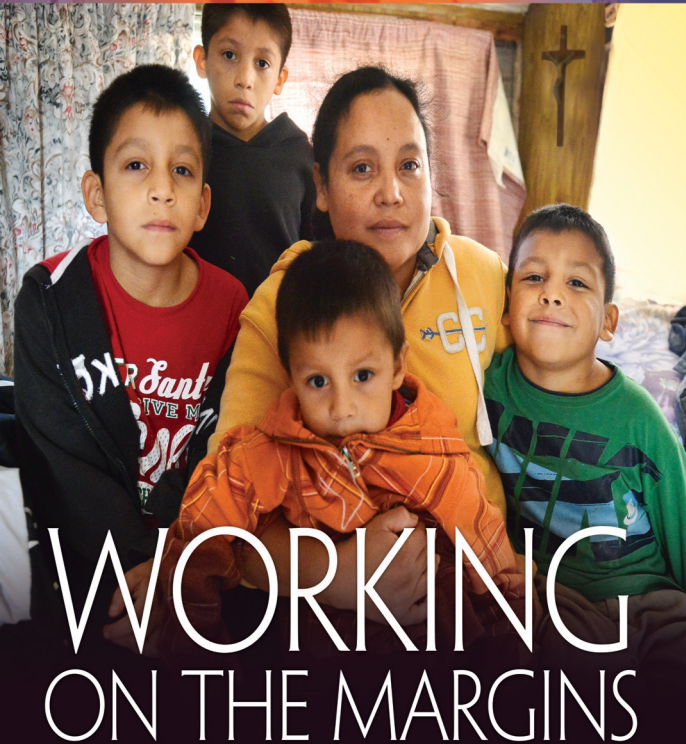

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

Más de 46 millones de personas en nuestro País viven en la pobreza. La Campaña Católica para el Desarrollo Humano (CCHD) es un esfuerzo contra la pobreza de nuestra Iglesia, que ayuda a las personas a encontrar esperanza y una mejor vida. Al apoyar esta colecta, usted llegará a aquellos que el Papa Francisco describe de la periferia económica y social, y quiere ofrecerles una ayuda verdadera.

Como ejemplo: En los alrededores de Charleston, Carolina del Sur, muchos niños viven en condiciones de pobreza con un futuro incierto. Con un sistema escolar en deterioro que lucha por ofrecer una mejor calidad educativa y disciplinaria, con escuelas con altos índices de niños arrestados en sus propios establecimientos escolares. Al involucrar congregaciones y comunidades de la ciudad, como el Ministerio de Justicia del Área de Charleston, les ha permitido mejorar el sistema educacional, consiguiendo que los niños permanezcan en las escuelas, y mantenerlos fuera del sistema juvenil de justicia.

Con su apoyo a la Colecta de CCHD, el Ministerio de Justicia del Área de Charleston incrementará la participación comunitaria, reducirá los arrestos juveniles y la violencia que le caracteriza.

Cerca de casa: El Proyecto del Valle de Naugatuck (NVP) CT Organización apoyada por CCHD, ha logrado edificar comunidades; desarrollando liderazgo y ayudando a identificar necesidades que requieren solución comunitaria como vivienda y trabajo.

Una vez identificado un problema en cuatro edificios de gran altura en Waterbury donde viven adultos mayores, NVP, trabajó con oficiales públicos de la ciudad logrando reducir el costo de los estacionamientos del área para trabajadores de la salud que daban servicio a personas mayores de edad en esa área. La necesidad constante de los trabajadores de estar atendiendo los parquímetros de estacionamientos era un problema, porque debían dejar sin cuidado a las personas que estaban atendiendo. Hoy, precios más asequibles están disponibles - tal vez en cierta manera algo pequeño, pero muy significativo para las personas involucradas.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

More than 46 million people in our country are living in poverty. The Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) is an anti-poverty effort on the part of our Church to help people find hope and a better life. Our support for this collection reaches those whom Pope Francis describes as living on the economic and social “peripheries”, or margins, offering them a hand up, not a hand out.

An example: Around Charleston, South Carolina, many children live in poverty, with an uncertain future. Deteriorating school systems struggle to provide quality education and appropriate discipline, and there is a high rate of school- based arrests. By engaging congregations and communities all over the city, the Charleston Area Justice Ministry is working to improve the education system and keep kids in school and out of the juvenile justice system. With the support of the national CCHD Collection, the Charleston Area Justice Ministry is able to provide community engagement to reduce youth arrests and violence.

Closer to home: the Naugatuck Valley Project (NVP), a recipient of support from the CCHD, builds community, develops leaders and helps them organize to address community issues such as housing and jobs. Having identified a problem in Waterbury for residents of four downtown elderly high-rise buildings, NVP, working with city officials, helped create a reduced rate parking permit for home healthcare workers serving the elderly. The problem was the constant need of caregivers to attend to their expiring parking meters, leaving the elderly resident alone. Now an affordable parking lot is available—something small in some ways, but very significant to the people involved.
