CHARGES:

As Law Lord:

Causation in Fact then in law to establish the following:- Accessory after the fact

Section 8 of the Accessories and Abettors Act 1861 then covers, "Whosoever shall aid, abet, counsel or procure the commission of [any offence], shall be liable to be tried or indicted and punished as a "principal offender."

1. Treason Felony contrary to the Treason Felony Act 1848 and malfeasance in office under common law in that he lied to Parliament and the people of the United Kingdom.
- 2..Contrary to Section 5(2) of the Criminal Law Act 1977 in common law he did conspire to corrupt public morals(S5(3), and outrage public decency as well as being guilty of "malfeasance in office" under common law, for defending a known torturer Augusto Pinochet in 1999 and also using the trick of "selective conclusion-ing" to exonerate the Blair regime in the Hutton Inquiry and thereby subverting the cause of justice.
3. Perjury contrary to S1(1) of the Perjury Act 1911 in that he did lie.
