****We see God** in His Word and **see Him** in the world we live in.

I had fainted, unless I had believed to **see** the goodness of the LORD in the land of the living. Psalms 27:13 KJV

O taste and **see** that the LORD is good: blessed is the man that trusteth in him. Psalms 34:8 KJV

Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path. Psalms 119:105 KJV As God's Word lights our path and we follow it not only do we see His goodness, but others see His goodness in us. ****We can touch God.** He can touch us. He touches others through us.

And, behold, a woman, which was diseased with an issue of blood twelve years, came behind him, and touched the hem of his garment: For she said within herself, **If I may but touch his garment**, I shall be whole. Matthew 9:20-21 KJV

Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need. Hebrews 4:16 KJV

Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and **touch not** the unclean thing; and I will receive you. 2 Corinthians 6:17 KJV

****You can taste God.**

How sweet are thy words unto my taste! yea, sweeter than honey to my mouth! Psalms 119:103 KJV

O taste and see that the LORD is good: blessed is the man that trusteth in him. Psalms 34:8 KJV

Perhaps your taste for food is gone, or your taste for life has soured, taste Him, His goodness never fails us.

****Listen and you will hear.**

Cause me to hear thy lovingkindness in the morning; for in thee do I trust: cause me to know the way wherein I should walk; for I lift up my soul unto thee. Psalms 143:8 KJV

But God has blessed you. You understand what you see with your eyes. And you understand what you hear with your ears. Matthew 13:15-16 ERV

*****What do you smell?***

What do you smell like?

They have ears, but they hear not: noses have they, but **they smell not:** Psalms 115:6 KJV

But I have all, and abound: I am full, having received of Epaphroditus the things which were sent from you, **an odor of a sweet smell**, a sacrifice acceptable, well pleasing to God.

Philippians 4:18 KJV
