Ft. Jennings Council #88 Visits Jim Bowsher's Temple of Tolerance



Ft. Jennings council #88 traveled to Wapakoneta on Wednesday, September 12 for their meeting and toured the Temple of Tolerance. The yard belongs to Jim Bowsher, self-described "master" of the Temple. He took 18 years to build it. The Temple and its satellite shrines occupy all of the space behind Jim's home -- and that's a lot of space, because Jim owns the entire center of the block, roughly equal to about two dozen Wapakoneta back yards. It's unexpected and well-hidden; people driving past Jim's front door, on Wood Street, probably don't even know its back there.

The Temple of Tolerance is always open, and visitors who want the full Jim Bowsher experience can call ahead to arrange a personal tour. Jim hopes to someday donate his creation to Wapakoneta, but only if the town promises to keep it intact, admission is free, and open every day. "Even if it's torn down tomorrow", he said, "they will never

erase the good that it's done."

His message is simple yet powerful! He wants everyone to be treated the same and given a chance. There is no bullying or drugs there. Every rock has a story and he has it all recorded. Such an amazing place!

A photo of "The Tube" is shown below. "The Tube" is Jim's creation and contains a shell casing for every soldier, from Ohio, that died since the War of 1812. Jim has spent time picking up every one of those casings from local police gun ranges. Thus far, "The Tube" contains over 71,000 casings.

Do you know what your library has to offer? Thanks to Kathleen Witt, council #86 knows. Kathleen spoke about the library levy and everything they now have to offer. They have loaned over 2,000 books, have a history room and an archive of newspapers from as far back as 1853 on microfilm. She noted they have fax, laminate and die cut availability. They have meeting rooms and 12 computer stations with Microsoft access and high speed internet. There are weekly programs for preschoolers through adults that include music concerts, book talks, cooking demonstrations and much more.

Since 2015 they have installed a new digital microfilm reader, 6 additional computers, are able to accept credit cards, have automatic renewal, clothing swaps, and automatic door openers in the front entrance. In addition to all of that, new landscaping has been completed, signage, access to job search portals and "how to" databases. Many of these projects were conducted in cooperation with the Wyandot County Community Foundation and Friends of the Library. Reach out to see what your local library offers.
