Ages 14 – 21 learn to work, prepare for the workplace and certification, these have more cognitive functions

then largely developmentally challenged ages 14 – 21

Mayor does a walk every 4 or 5 weeks in the area to measure progress. Transportation is a flagged concern. SB7 Transportation committee. Means of transportation within 6 neighborhoods. Suggestions welcome. ON the AB calendar are the Transportation meetings

Denizens of Hanover and Patapsco mounted on dirt bikes.Currently not much that can be done

Re-entry program: offer services to those on probation, the prison officers that work on re-entry are willing to come out and talk to the youth in this area, so are some former inmates to try and reach them.

Is there anything can do to help? Children's Guild also works with DJS youth. Individual attention.

The police can come only if you call, call them. If you see prostitutes, call! If you witness solicitation call! You can take pictures while you are outside, but not inside. Fences for stairwell are recommended. The Children's Guild is abuses over the weekend.

Problem properties nested inside VRI. Squatters come in and it takes 60 days or more to evict them.

Monitoring program for properties, awareness for landlords to show up to court.
