


AUTUMN TERM NEWSLETTER



Harvesting our fruit and vegetables, has allowed the children to see the full cycle from sowing the seeds, nurturing the allotment beds, watering the plants, then harvesting and best of all eating the produce. We have shared cucumbers, blackcurrants (which we made into jam), sugar-snap peas and tomatoes at snack times. The surplus was made available for parents to take home.

We are grateful to everyone who donated to our home-grown harvest. We raised £20.11 which will go towards our next planting!

We had a bumper crop of sunflowers this year which self-seeded from last year's crop and we have been able to use the heads for printing, counting, weighing, predicting, cutting and using in the mud kitchen. The chickens have been keeping everyone entertained by eating the scraps left on the floor after snack and lunchtime, joining in with the dinosaur games and producing lots of eggs.
