

Incentives and Goals

A new base incentive of \$275 has been implemented for 2023, an increase from \$250 as was offered in years past.

Goals are 42 pounds for the cities (down from 43 pounds in 2022) as well as 34 pounds for the townships (35 in 2022).





Comingling at Wright County

A big change is coming to the Wright County Recycling Facility this spring. The shift to a comingle recycling drop off will be the new way for residents to recycle some of their waste. This includes regular curbside recycling materials (cardboard/paper, metals, plastics, glass) to allow residents a faster and safer drop-off experience without the need to sort on site. No appointments needed — Residents are welcome to visit during hours of operation on Tuesdays & Thursdays from 9:00 am to 6:00 pm and every 2nd/3rd Saturday of each month from 8:00 am to 12:00 pm for disposal.

Waste Wizard by ReCollect

"How can I get rid of an old mattress?"

"Where can I go to dispose of broken concrete from a basement project in my home?"

"Who can take old medication that's expired?"



The Wright County Recycling Facility can't take it all, so we've found a solution instead. Waste Wizard by ReCollect is a digital recycling search engine for residents to access information on how and where to properly dispose of household items based on location. Scheduled hauling times will not be listed for trash pickup, but contact information and web links will be readily available on-demand.

Compost & Yard Waste Accepted Items:

Grass clippings, tree and shrub prunings, tree limbs, stumps, roots (no dirt/packed clay or rocks), clean lakeshore weeds, garden waste accepted without size restrictions nor limit to amount accepted. Residents are required to debag all materials and are asked to take the empty bags as they leave. The yard and garden wastes are composted over the winter months and the brush pile will be shredded by a tub grinder to produce a wood mulch. The finished compost and wood mulch are available to residents free of charge while supplies last.
