

# Membership Renewal Clock is Ticking! Do Not Get Read Out!

The 2024 Membership Renewal forms are being mailed this month.

Renewals and dues payments have a deadline of **February 7, 2024.**We strongly encourage members to renew as they are able (sooner rather than later preferred) but prior to the deadline. Membership renewals are **officially due in January 2024 with February 7th as the final deadline.** 

Members who desire to Resign may do so using the Membership Renewal form. Resignation provides members with the ability to rejoin when they are ready to do so by paying the going rate for membership dues. Resigned members remain in good standing.

Non-payment of dues will result in your membership status becoming "read out". This means you are no longer a member in good standing and have lost your membership privileges.

To rejoin as a "reapplicant", you must go through the membership process like a new member including having sponsors, paying the going rate for dues and our administrative fee, and being voted on by the membership. All "Read Out" members will be notified of their status following the closure of the membership renewal period (February 7, 2024).



## **Passages**

George Osgood, member, passed on December 18, 2023 at the age of 80 after a long, courageous battle with cancer. A life-long resident of Marblehead, he excelled in football playing at Marblehead, Cushing Academy and UMass Amherst. His achievements included a long career in steel work and his projects included many area landmarks such as the Gillette Building, the Western Electric building, the Pentucket Bridge, and the MBTA Savin Hill bridge. He became a senior field engineer and supervised steel erectors for the Surrey Nuclear Power Plant. He supervised the erections of 54 floors of Tower A of the NY WTC. He later helped with recovery efforts following 9/11. He ran Marblehead Steel Erection & Supply for over 25 years working pm projects throughout New England. George also had a long career in real estate, developing commercial and residential properties including three of his own homes. At ease with machines, he loved them ranging from dirt bikes to construction equipment. He had a vast skill set. He loved to travel and embraced adventure.
