May 19, 1994- NOW ON THIS DAY, The Court met with Francis Webster, Manager of the Public Water Supply District No. 1 of Ralls County to discuss getting rural water to Ashburn. The Commissioners signed the following Court Order:

ORDINANCE: Now on this 19th day of May, 1994, comes on for the hearing of the petition of for permission and authority to install and maintain a water pipe line in and along the public road which is County Road #7 and the Streets of Ashburn, MO to facilitate the furnishing of water to the residents of said Ashburn area and to other residents of Pike County residing nearby;

And the Court having carefully considered said petition, and having heard the evidence in support thereof, and being fully advised in the premises, finds that the allegations of said petition are true, and that said P.W.S.D. #1 of Ralls County is entitled to the relief prayed for.

It is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed that the P.W.S.D. #1 of Ralls Co. be, and it is hereby is, authorized to install and maintain a water pipe line in and along the public roads described in the first paragraph hereof, subject, however, to the following rules and regulations: (1) That said P.W.S.D. #1 of Ralls Co. repair and restore said County road to its original condition following the installation of any and maintaining work on said water pipe line; (2) That such installation and maintenance be conducted and performed in such a manner and at such time as not unreasonable to interrupt or interfere with the normal flow of traffic upon said county road; (3) That such water pipe line installed in said road at a sufficient depth as not to interfere in any way with the maintenance thereof; (4) That water pipe line not be installed in the traveled portion of said public road.

The foregoing petition and order has this day been fully examined by the Pike County Court, and the same hereby is approved by the said Court, and spread on the records of the Pike County Court in **County Court Record No. E-58** at page 150.

September 16, 1993- THE PIKE COUNTY COURT makes the following changes to the **National Flood Insurance Ordinance** that was adopted on April 1, 1981. The wording change affects Nos. 8 and 9 on Resolution B and changes the words "market value" to "pre-flood replacement cost". Also the phrase "This is for primary residents only." will be added.

March 5, 1987- **The Flood Plain Management Ordinance** adopted by Pike County on March 5, 1987 in compliance with the current National Flood Insurance Program Regulations. (See attached ordinance.)
