

As its website reads, the organization "envisions a financially inclusive world where people from all ages and backgrounds can hold the power to improve their lives through the world of entrepreneurship." C.E.O. allows people to loan money to low-income entrepreneurs and students all over the world through its programs. These are done through donations, which could give young entrepreneurs the chance to chase their dreams.

Students are also given access to C.E.O.'s private crowdfunding page, which allows them to seek investments to start or grow their businesses. The organization includes personal stories of each person, paving the way for their team of donors to connect with their entrepreneurs or students on a human level.

Aside from this non-profit organization, Zachary Sarf was also able to build his own business in college called FlipFlop. This is a travel company focusing on a marketplace where users can buy and sell hotel rooms with each other. Despite FlipFlop being a success—it was selected as an alpha start-up company at the Web Summit—Zachary also experienced his fair share of struggles in starting the business. This is why he is even more inspired to help other entrepreneurs, especially those from the younger generation, through C.E.O..



Zachary is eager to connect with more high school students and high school administrators to widen C.E.O.'s reach. The Managing Director hopes for the organization to soon be present in every high school across the United States. With this, they could empower more youth to be financially literate and have the skills to tackle their entrepreneurial dreams.

The availability of resources and opportunities like these are often life-saving for many. The power to own and grow a business, as well as being financially literate, could not only possibly change one's life, but also that person's community, and even the world.
