



The National Canal Museum, located in Easton, Pennsylvania, is the only PHMC heritage site to possess “national” status, as it is the signature program of the Delaware & Lehigh National Heritage Corridor. It consists of a downtown indoor museum and an outdoor canal boat ride on a restored portion of the Lehigh Canal. The indoor museum shares space with the Crayola Museum.



This lock marks the far end of the canal boat tour. The view to the left looks west, from where Anthracite coal and other goods arrived for shipment south to Philadelphia on the Delaware Canal. Turning around, the visitor sees the beautiful panorama, below, including the lock tender's house.
