Clay County Fair

2021 Open Class Division Exhibit Book

1. **All Open Class exhibits will be entered on Tuesday, August 10 from 4 to 6 p.m.** No entries accepted after 6 p.m. on Tuesday, August 10. All exhibits will be released between 10:00 and 11:00 am on Sunday, August 15. All exhibits **MUST BE checked out with Open Class committee for exhibitor protection.**
2. **Junior Junior Division.** This division is defined as youth in pre-school and pre-kindergarten prior to the County Fair. Children in this age group usually need more help from a parent. See the Junior Junior Division page showing the areas exhibitors can enter in. [This division will use the blue entry card.](#)
3. **JUNIOR ONLY DIVISION.** Junior is defined as youth in Kindergarten through 8th grade prior to County Fair. Youth are not limited to the Junior page. [Junior age youth will use gold entry cards.](#) Exhibits will be judged according to rules of the division.
4. **YOUTH ONLY DIVISION.** Youth is defined as being in grades 9 – 12 prior to County Fair. [Youth will not use the Junior page. Youth exhibitors will use the lime green entry card.](#) Exhibits will be judged according to the rules of the division.
5. Department Awards – All exhibits will be awarded ribbons. Best of Show, second and third place exhibits will be selected from each department and receive \$15, \$10 and \$5 cash prize, respectively. Awards will be provided by the Clay County Fair Association. **Please note: Best of Show in each department cannot be won two (2) years in a row.**
6. Exhibitors must be legal residents of Clay County or adjacent counties.
7. The Clay County Fair Association will not be held responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits. Every precaution is taken for the safekeeping of exhibits.
8. Entries must be the work of the exhibitor, completed since August 2019 and not exhibited at any previous County Fair or Achievement Days.
9. Exhibitors may enter in as many classes as desired, but no more than two entries per lot. Exhibits must demonstrate different learning experiences.
10. Judging will be conducted without spectators.
11. Judges decision is final.
12. Exhibit pre-registration is not required. If you would like to complete entry tags before entry time, tags can be picked up at the Fair Office prior to or during entry times.
13. **We are always in need of volunteers for registration night and helping the judges. If you would like to help, please call the office.**

All food items must be able to be served and stored at room temperature. **A recipe must accompany all culinary exhibits on a 3" X 5" recipe card.** Please note only a portion of each culinary exhibit will be put on display.

FLORICULTURE DEPARTMENT

All exhibits must be real flowers, vines and/or plants. No artificial material. Leave some foliage – do not remove all leaves on fresh flowers - only those that extend in the water. Exhibitor must bring unlabeled container for exhibit. Small, easily-tipped containers are not acceptable.

CLASS 44 - ARRANGEMENTS

- To be exhibited in artistic container, suitability of container to arrangement will be considered in judging. Small accessories permitted.

CLASS 48 - COLLECTION OF PLANTS

Grown in one container. Plant names to be included on entry card.

Lot 282: Hanging Basket - 3 to 5 varieties, blooming plants and colorful foliage

Lot 283: Terrarium - planted with one or more varieties for artistic effect

Lot 284: Stump or log gardens - two or more varieties, diameter of stump or log not to exceed 24 inches, must be self-supporting.

Lot 285: Mixed Patio Planter

CLASS 49– DRIED FLOWERS

Exhibit should be fully dry. Exhibits should be collected in a bundle and wrapped in florist's tissue. Exhibit may be dried by air, water or microwave. Glycerin, silica gel maybe used. Freeze-dry materials, artificial colors, sprays and dyes are not permitted. Flower name to be included on entry card.

Lot 286: Dried Flower - Any Variety

Lot 287: Potpourri - flower petals and leaves preserved for fragrant qualities, arranged in attractive container.

Lot 288: Dried Seed Head or Pressed Flower - collection of 3 to 10 varieties of flowers or leaves attractively displayed on a solid background in an 8"x10" standing photo frame.



FOOD PRESERVATION DEPARTMENT

Exhibits must be in standard clear glass jars: one-half pint, one pint, and one quart size as noted in the classes. Jelly, jam and preserves must be in standard one-half pint jars, sealed and processed. Exhibit one jar in each lot. ALL food preservation must be processed by boiling water bath or pressure canner. Please fill out food preservation form at back of the book and include with entry. Processing times must follow USDA recommendations. Screw band ring should accompany exhibit. Jam, jelly and preserves will be opened for tasting. Exhibits must have been processed/preserved after August 2018. Refer to the USDA Complete Guide to Home Canning, 2015 Revision, Agriculture Information Bulletin No. 539 on the National Center for Home Food Preservation website, http://www.uga.edu/nchfp/publications/publications_usda.html.

CLASS 55 GARDEN VEGETABLES AND FRUITS

Lot 298: Apples any variety - exhibit 3 with stems

Lot 299: Snap Beans - pods should have one-fourth to one-half inch stems - exhibit 5 pods

Lot 300: Beets – 1 – 2 ½" diameter, do not remove tap root, trim tops to 1" - exhibit 3

Lot 301: Broccoli Head – 3" stalk, at least 6" long, exhibit 1 head

Lot 302: Cabbage do not remove wrapper leaves, one-fourth inch long stems, exhibit 1 head

Lot 303: Carrot, Medium - 4 to 6", do not remove tip or root, trim top to 1", exhibit 3

Lot 304: Carrot, Long – 6" and over, do not remove tip or root, trim top to 1", exhibit 3

Lot 305: Cauliflower - curd should be at least 4" in diameter, trim outer leaves around the curd, exhibit 1 head

Lot 306: Cucumber, Pickling - 3 to 6 inches long, leave stems, exhibit 3

Lot 307: Cucumber, Slicing - over 6 inches long; 2 inches in diameter, leave stems, exhibit 3

Lot 308: Eggplant - leave stems attached, 6 to 8 inches, exhibit 1

Lot 309: Honeydew Melon - exhibit 1

Lot 310: Kohlrabi stem removed 2" below ball, exhibit 3

Lot 311: Onions, Dry, White, Yellow or Red - do not remove outer scale, trim roots, and exhibit 3

Lot 312: Onions, Green bunching - tops are twisted and trimmed, exhibit 5

Lot 313: Peppers, Hot - any variety, small or long tapering, leave stems, trim to level of shoulder, exhibit 5

Lot 314: Peppers, Sweet - any variety, green, red or yellow; blocky or pointed type, leave stems on, trim to level of shoulder, exhibit 3

Lot 315: Potato, Red, Russet or Gold - exhibit 3

Lot 316: Potato, Sweet - exhibit 3

Lot 317: Pumpkin - exhibit 1

Lot 318: Squash Summer - including zucchini, stems trimmed to 1-2", exhibit 3

Lot 319: Squash Winter - stems trimmed to 1 to 2", exhibit 1

Lot 320: Sweet Corn include husk, cut 1" square window in husk to reveal well-filled kernels, trim top, exhibit 3

Lot 321: Tomato, Standard -remove stems, exhibit 3

Lot 322: Tomato, Cherry or Pear - remove stems, exhibit 5

- Lot 323:** Watermelon - stem attached, exhibit 1
Lot 324: Novelty Vegetable - naturally grown, unusual vegetable or any odd specimen

CLASS 56: HEIRLOOM VEGETABLES

These plants are rich in history. Entries must include the background or history of the variety on a 3" x 5" card.

Lot 327: Heirloom Carrot - tip attached trim top to 1/2", exhibit 3
Lot 328: Heirloom Corn include husk cut 1" square window in husk to reveal well-filled kernels, trim top, exhibit 1
Lot 329: Heirloom Potato - exhibit 1
Lot 330: Heirloom Tomato - remove stem, exhibit 3

CLASS 57 - HERBS

Herbs are exhibited in plant form. To make an attractive exhibit, more than one specimen of herb may be planted in pot.

- Lot 331:** Herb Plant Single Any Variety - write common name on entry tag
Lot 332: Kitchen Collection - 3 to 6 herbs to enhance cooking, write common names on entry tag. If unknown, then write "unknown" on entry tag



CLASS 58 - GARDEN CRAFTS

Gardeners today incorporate more than just plants. Modern horticulture must also draw knowledge from related fields. Garden crafts include a variety of interests that help gardeners grow along with their gardens. Exhibits completed after August 2019.

- Lot 333:** Bird Feeder - dimensions should be correct for actual use and outdoor sturdy, indicate species of bird on entry tag

- Lot 334:** Wildlife House - house for birds, bats, bees, butterflies, ladybugs, toads; dimensions should be correct for actual use and outdoor sturdy, indicate species of wildlife on entry tag

- Lot 335:** Fairy Garden - create miniature landscape in a single container

- Lot 336:** Any Garden Craft Not Listed above

NEEDLEWORK DEPARTMENT

All articles should be displayed in a clear plastic bag. Exhibits must be completed after August 2019.

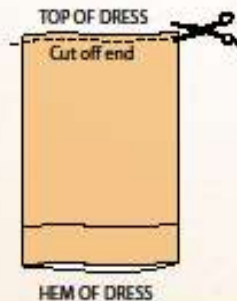

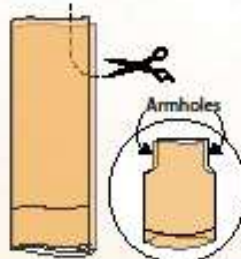

Cut off the sewn end of the pillowcase.



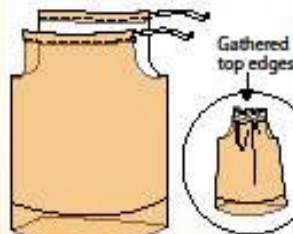

Fold pillowcase in half and cut armholes. Cut through all thicknesses, about 4 inches down and 2 inches in.

Fold down the top about 3/8" at the front and the back. Edgestitch to make a casing. Slide 6 inches of 1/4" elastic through to cause it to gather in the front and repeat for the back.



4

Cut two 38-inch lengths of double-fold bias tape for armholes. Fold each in half and stitch along armholes, leaving extra at the top to tie dress at the shoulders. Trim is optional.
