Accessibility

- This summer will bring the grand opening of our Discovery Garden at Elawa Farm Foundation. This ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) accessible garden will host education programs and experiential learning opportunities for community members of all ages and abilities.
- The new central pathway on our farm grounds offers ADA accessibility for visitors to explore our gardens. The pathway is accessible for limited mobility devices, including wheelchairs, and strollers. Take in the beautiful vista of our historic buildings and gardens on the pathway.

Expansion

- With the recent closing of our campus neighbor, Wildlife Discovery Center, Elawa Farm Foundation is working with the City of Lake Forest to thoughtfully plan the future use their former space.
- Our plans include additional family programs, farm-to-table food service, and the potential for additional farm animals at Elawa Farm. Follow our website and social media for updates.

Youth & Family Programming

- We are expanding our summer camp offerings, including our popular Farm-to-Table Cooking Camp, and increasing session hours.
- Join us for free weekly farm tours and fun family activities, grounded in sustainable agriculture and therapeutic horticulture, on Saturdays during the Garden Market season.
- We are offering collaborative music sessions with local musician, Jamberry Music, and interactive story time sessions with Lake Forest Library at Elawa Farm on Fridays and Saturdays throughout the summer.







Our Garden Market features freshly harvested produce and flowers from our garden, savory treats and baked goods from our kitchen, and local food items, including eggs and meat, from regional farms and vendors. Our shelves are stocked with a curated selection of artisan products, such as high-quality garden tools, recently released cookbooks, and more. Enjoy pop-up grill out events, featuring ribs, housemade sausages, picnic sides, and more on select weekends this summer.

This year, we will host market festivals to celebrate the season. These special market days will showcase additional vendors and family programming.


