Mental Health Act permits the apprehension/custody of someone to be examined by a physician if there are reasonable and probable grounds to believe that the person:

- Has threatened or attempted to threaten to cause bodily harm to self;
- Behave violently towards others or cause other to fear bodily harm;
- Shows lack of competence to care for self and shows signs of mental disorder which may result in harm to self or other or in serious physical impairment.



Form 1 under the Mental Health Act

- Authorizes the apprehension, detention and assessment of a person under the *Mental Health Act*
- Issued by a physician
- Person must be assessed with 72 hours
- Can lead to
 - Voluntary admission;
 - Involuntary admission;
 - Release from hospital



Form 2 under the Mental Health Act

- Authorizes the apprehension, detention and assessment of a person under the *Mental Health Act*
- Anyone can request a Justice of the Peace to issue this form
- The Applicant must show:
 - Evidence of mental illness
 - Danger to self or other
 - Failure to care for his/her needs
 - Provide as much info as possible, including history of violence or illness, possession of weapons, person's whereabouts...

Legal obligations under the Condo Act:

- Duty to accommodate disabilities short of undue hardship
- Disabilities include mental impairment, mental disability...
- Duty to accommodate includes:
 - A procedural duty (listen, communicate, be respectful...)
 - A substantive duty (try to find a solution if possible)
- It's a delicate balancing act



Legal obligations under the Condo Act

- Corps. have a duty to control, manage and administer the common elements and assets of the corporation
- Owners must comply with Act, declaration, by-laws and rules;
- Corps. Must take all reasonable steps to ensure compliance;
- Dangerous activities are prohibited in units or common elements;
- Corps. Can seek the assistance of the courts to obtain compliance. This may lead to eviction;



Legal obligations under the Condo Act

- Under the <u>new Act</u>, eviction can only be ordered by a court and only if:
 - A person poses a serious risk to heath and safety **OR** serious risk of damage to property;
 - If person is found to be unsuited for the communal occupation/use of the property **AND** no other order will be adequate to enforce compliance
