# EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS CHECKLIST

Review this checklist and prepare for a quick and safe evacuation.

Essentials for Your "Go Bag" ---- (Create one for each household member who is old enough to carry one)

NLY TAKE WHAT YOU CAN. USE A COMFORATBLE/EASY TO CARRY BACKPACK - DO NOT OVERPACK!

<b>~</b>	In a Ziploc bag, gather all important documents: ID, passports, birth certificates, health cards, banking info, insurance policies,
in۱	vestment documents
<b>~</b>	Cash (in small bills). Include debit and credit cards in case ATMs are still functional.
<b>~</b>	Essential medications & a list of prescriptions. You should also include basics like Advil and important vitamins
<b>~</b>	Non-perishable food & water: Please <u>ration responsibly</u> and consider including electrolyte packets or nutrient-dense foods
<b>~</b>	Make a video of your possessions, house, and property. Save the file on a flash drive in a Ziploc bag
<b>~</b>	A small external hard drive or flash drive containing: Important photos and documents you don't want to lose. Use Ziploc bag!
<b>~</b>	A small address book with important contacts: Doctors, clinics, insurance companies, etc.
<b>~</b>	Cell phone charger
<b>~</b>	Portable two-way radios & chargers (ensure they are fully charged)
<b>~</b>	Small, battery-operated AM/FM radio for emergency broadcasts
<b>~</b>	Personal hygiene items (travel-sized)
<b>~</b>	Clothing for 3–4 days
<b>~</b>	Supplies for children & infants: small toys & books, clothes, diapers, formula, bottles
<b>~</b>	Emergency tools (small and useful): Leatherman, jackknife, compact hatchet, GPS, can opener, Utensils, rope, flashlight, batteries,
th	ermal blanket, etc.
<b>~</b>	Small first aid kit
<b>~</b>	Family heirlooms (only if space allows)

#### Prepare Your Family, Pets, & Livestock

- ✓ If possible, evacuate children and non-essential family members first to simplify preparations.
- Designate a "safe place" and an emergency contact person.
- ✓ Plan multiple evacuation routes to your safe location.
- ✓ Share your evacuation plans with your contact person.
- Evacuate pets and livestock wherever possible. Contact the Humane Society or neighbours for help if needed.
- ☑ Ensure all family members are familiar with your plan and the emergency notification systems/alerts.

## Prepare Your Vehicle

- ☑ Fill your gas tank. ☑ Park facing outward in the garage or driveway for a quick exit.
- ✓ Learn how to manually open your garage door. ✓ Roll up all windows and keep the vehicle unlocked.
- ✓ Pack only essential items. ✓ If you don't drive, arrange transportation in advance.

### What to Wear During Evacuation

- ✓ Wear only cotton or wool clothing: Long-sleeved shirt, long pants, light jacket, hat, and comfortable boots.
- Carry with you: Gloves, a handkerchief (for smoke), water bottle, and a pair of goggles (also for smoke)
- Keep your cell phone, flashlight, and portable radio with you at all times.
  Tune into local radio for emergency instructions.

### Prepare the Inside of Your Home (Before Fire Evacuation)

- ☑ Close all interior doors ☑ Leave a light on in every room ☑ Remove flammable items from around windows
- ✓ Close fire-resistant curtains, shutters, or blinds (if available)
  ✓ Turn off all pilot lights
- ✓ Move overstuffed furniture to the center of the room
  ✓ Close fireplace dampers and any openings (e.g., pet doors)

### Prepare the Outside of Your Home (Before Fire Evacuation)

- ✓ Bring combustible patio furniture indoors ✓ Shut off propane or natural gas at the meter
- Close exterior vents, doors, and windows. If time allows, seal all these openings with 1½" thick plywood.
- 🗹 Prop a non-combustible ladder against your house for firefighter access 🛮 🗸 Leave all exterior doors and gates unlocked
- ✓ Turn on exterior lights
  ✓ Connect a hose to your outside faucet
- **☑ Do NOT** leave sprinklers running this can affect municipal water pressure during a critical time

PLEASE STAY SAFE AND CAUTIOUS DURING AN EVACUATION. HELP OTHERS IF YOU ARE ABLE. IT'S NEVER TOO LATE TO BE PREPARED!
