

## **Topic: “What is salvation and who is it for?”**

Zacharias prophesies that Yahawah “visited and redeemed His people... to be saved from our enemies and from the hand of all that hate us” (Luke 1:68–71)

What is Salvation and who is it...

### **Why Israel Was Chosen**

The speaker explains Deuteronomy 7:7 — Israel was not chosen for size, but because Yahawah swore an **oath to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob**

What is Salvation and who is it...

.To understand **why** Abraham was chosen, the lesson turns to **Jubilees**:

- Abraham rejected idol worship at age 14
- He prayed to be delivered from the errors of mankind
- Yahawah responded by calling him out and making a covenant with him

What is Salvation and who is it...

This covenant promised:

Abraham → Isaac → Jacob → the **great multitude** (Israel)

What is Salvation and who is it...

### **Salvation Defined**

Salvation is **two-fold**:

1. **Deliverance from enemies**
2. **Cleansing from sin**

What is Salvation and who is it...

This pattern appears repeatedly:

- Psalm 14 & 53 – “Oh that the salvation of Israel were come out of Zion”
- Isaiah 45:17 – “Israel shall be saved... with an everlasting salvation”
- Ezekiel 39 – Israel delivered from captivity and cleansed by Yahawah’s Spirit

## **Israel's Captivity**

Deuteronomy 28:64 foretold Israel would be scattered among all nations.

The speaker connects this to the **Trans-Atlantic Slave Trade** and global dispersion of Israelites

## **Two Houses of Israel**

Ezekiel 37 explains:

- Judah and Israel (two sticks) will reunite
- Yahawah will gather His people from among the nations
- He will **save and cleanse them**

## **What Happens to Other Nations**

Isaiah 14 and 60 show:

- Nations will serve Israel
- Those who refuse will perish
- Israel becomes the Kingdom of priests ruling over nations

#### 5) Community Summary

**Salvation is not a generic religious idea — it is a covenant promise.**

Yahawah chose Abraham because he rejected idolatry. Through Isaac and Jacob, that promise became the nation of Israel. Salvation means Israel will be **delivered from captivity and cleansed from sin.**

Today, Israel is scattered worldwide, just as Scripture said. The awakening happening now is the fulfillment of Ezekiel 37 — the dry bones coming to life.

When Yahawashi returns, Israel will be restored, and the nations will come to serve the Kingdom of Yahawah.
