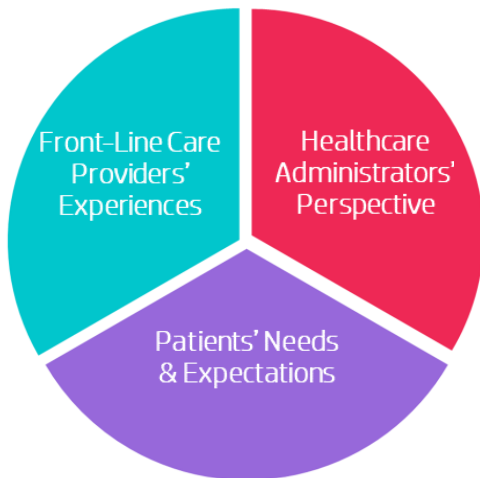

National Maternal Mortality & Morbidity Prevention Campaign – “Save Moms”

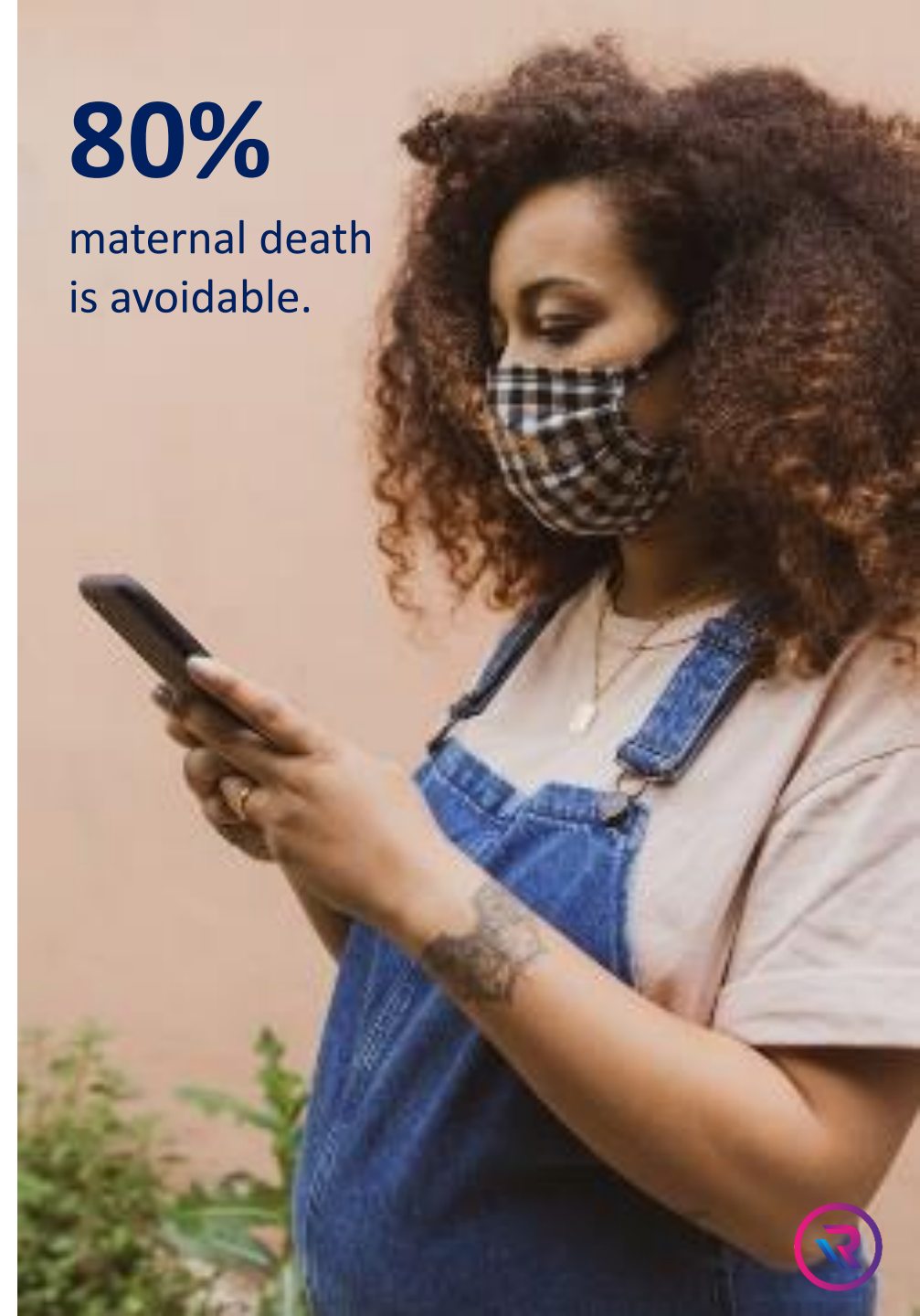
GOAL: Every pregnant woman in 3rd trimester to have a blood pressure (BP) monitor and monitor BP daily for a minimum of 180 days (90days pre and 90days post-partum). High BP is a common indicator of pre-eclampsia.

Making it Happen

- ✓ Rebates and subsidies for devices
- ✓ Provider reimbursement for telehealth
- ✓ Extending CMS regulations for monitoring mother
- ✓ Community health education (A role for mother & fathers)
- ✓ Clinician education
- ✓ Patient education

Four (4) Delays of Maternal Death & Injury:

1. Delay in seeking care
2. Delay in transportation
3. Delay & error in diagnosis
