#### "Jesus wept." — John 11:35

John 11:35 is one of the shortest verses in the Bible. Who else chose this one when asked to memorize a Bible verse? (Pastor Laura raises her hand.)

In this verse, Jesus weeps over the loss of his dear friend Lazarus. He may also be weeping in response to the deep grief of Lazarus's sisters, Mary and Martha, and the friends who had gathered. They had called on Jesus for healing, but he did not arrive in time. When Martha meets him, she says, "If you had been here, my brother would not have died." Soon after, Mary comes to him weeping and says the same thing. Jesus meets them both in their sorrow—and he, too, is overcome. He weeps with them.

We are entering a season when grief can spill over. This Sunday, we will invite families who have lost loved ones this year to come forward and light a candle in their memory. We will also make space to name aloud all the saints who have gone on to glory—to remember, to give thanks, to grieve.

This year, I have lost three uncles. All Saints Sunday will feel especially tender. The tears may catch in my throat, and they may fall. That will be okay.

November also ushers in the festivities of Thanksgiving and Christmas, which seem to fill every corner of our lives with commercials, plans, parties, and family gatherings. For some, this will be the first year an empty chair sits at the table. For others, a song, a smell, or a simple reminder will reopen the ache of grief. Tears may fall.

In December, we will hold a **Blue Christmas Service**—a time centered on the grief that can surface during this season and a space to bring that pain to the feet of Jesus. Grief is not always tied to physical death. It may come from job loss, estrangement, depression, or the death of a dream. Tears may fall.

I often hear people say they are afraid to come to church because they might cry. Some even apologize when they do, explaining that a hymn or a word from the sermon brought tears, or that they slipped out to the restroom so they wouldn't "disrupt the service."

Friends, hear this clearly: **Church is a place where you can bring your whole self. You should feel safe here.**Jesus wept. He didn't go off alone to hide his tears. He wept in the presence of his community.

May this season be one where we bring all that we are and all that we feel to Jesus and to this community of faith. May we sit with one another—not trying to talk each other out of our grief, but instead reminding one another that we are not alone.

May our tears become prayers, and our prayers become hope.
