While our ministries continue to impact lives and further God's work, we are currently facing a significant budget deficit of nearly \$30,000. This is not news any of us were hoping for, but it is a reality we must address together, prayerfully and with transparency.

I know conversations around finances can be uncomfortable, especially in a community of faith where we seek to focus on spiritual matters. But stewardship is a vital part of our discipleship, and how we manage our resources reflects our collective commitment to God's mission through this church.

There are a few factors that have contributed to this deficit. Some are external, like rising costs and unforeseen expenses. Others are internal, including a dip in giving. While this may feel like a setback, it is also an opportunity for us to reflect on the blessings we have received and to realign ourselves with the vision God has given us for this community.

I ask each of you to prayerfully consider how you can help us close this gap. Whether it's through a one-time gift, a pledge of support, or volunteering to help us strategize for the future, every contribution makes a difference. More than ever, we need to come together as a church family to ensure that our ministries continue to thrive and grow.

I am reminded of the Apostle Paul's words to the Philippians: "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God." (Philippians 4:6) This is a time for us to trust in God's provision, knowing that through our faithful action and prayer, God will guide us through this season.

Let us keep our focus on what matters most—the mission of Christ and the community we are building together. God has brought us this far, and I firmly believe that with faith, hope, and a willingness to step forward, we will overcome this challenge.

Thank you for your generosity, your prayers, and your unwavering commitment to our church.

Our commitments will be consecrated in worship on November 24.


Prairie Central District UMM Special Event
