There is a place aptly named "Sanctuary" and we have a hymn that proclaims, "Lord prepare me to be a sanctuary, pure and holy, tried and true. With thanksgiving, I'll be a living sanctuary for you." On the way out, there is also a "Labyrinth" which in ancient time to the present has been recognized as a sacred symbol for life or heroic journeys.

The Scripture reminds us that "Whether you turn to the right or to the left, you will hear a voice saying, "This is the way, walk in it." (Isaiah 30:21)

Life is a journey and we are given a gift of stewardship. You may find yourself in a journey this summer of faith but there is always a place where God can nurture your spirit. God will continue to nurture that spirit in our life together as a church. There is an opportunity for everyone.






SMALL MISSION PROJECTS

GRACE TELEPHONE UPDATE

At the beginning of June, our telephone system failed disabling all phones in the church, including the Daycare. Our telephone repairman declared the antiquated system more expensive to fix than to replace. Thankfully, church and daycare staff continued to conduct business as usual with a little ingenuity.

Three phone system providers proposed bids to replace our disabled system and the trustee board evaluated each along with input from paid and volunteer office and childcare staff. The system selection was based on the desire to hold costs down while providing the church building with modern phone service.

To support the internet-based phone system selected by the trustees, wiring had to be installed in the childcare area and a link was run from the childcare office to the church office. While this wiring project was in progress, it was decided to hardwire the a/v booth into the system as well. This a/v booth upgrade should improve the streaming of our Sunday services on the internet.

On Friday, July 23, the new phone system was installed by Comcast who is also our internet service provider. For anyone calling the

church or child care offices, this switch will be transparent.

Thanks to those who provided input and to Mike Parro whose IT services were critical to the success of this project.

ROOF LEAK

During the week of July 12, water damage to the south wall of the sanctuary was observed. An Adler Roofing repair technician found and repaired several holes in the flat roof above the area of interior damage. The drywall damage will be repaired after a few good rains to ensure the roof leak has been corrected. At that time, the trustees will be seeking a drywall contractor. If you have a suggestion, contact Greg DuBois.

During his time on the roof, the roofing technician discovered excessive debris on the roof and suggested that this kind of debris can be responsible for roof leaks and clogged roof drains.
