

Walk-thru Communion – Sunday, August 2nd

Pastor Romir will be serving communion IN THE SANCTUARY on Sunday, August 2nd from 11am-12pm!

With pandemic restrictions will in place, communion will be offered in a less traditional way. The following process will be in place for the in-church communion:

- Park in the parking lot (try to park every other parking spot to adhere to safety protocols)
- You will be greeted as you enter the church and follow the protocols in place for entering the building (sign in, temperature check)
- Enter the sanctuary through the center doors and proceed down the aisle to the front of the church where Pastor Romir will offer pre-packaged communion elements (just like the drive by communion in July)
- Exit the sanctuary through the front side door, then go directly out of the church through the Grace Place doors

Please remember that this for one hour – you do not have to arrive at 11:00 in order to receive communion. A limited number of people can be allowed in the church at one time. If you are unable to come to church, please notify the office and arrangements will be made for communion to be brought to you.

This is an exciting experiment to share in the body and blood of Christ together. Remember - ALL are Welcome "This is blood which is shed for you for in forgiveness of at Christ's Table.

How to Open the Individually Packaged Communion Sets

- (1) Inspect the communion cup set and note that there is actually layers separating the wafer from the juice. The topmost layer is a clear plastic sheet. Below that is the wafer which sits on top on a foil layer. That layer is what keeps the juice component sealed until ready for use.
- (2) Fold the tab back and forth to start the separation between



the clear plastic top layer and the foil layer below.

- (3) Carefully peel back the clear plastic layer to release the wafer.
- (4) Eat the wafer while remembering that Jesus said, "This is my body which is broken for you."
- (5) Carefully peel back the foil layer to open the juice cup.
- (6) Drink the juice while remembering that Jesus said, vour sins."
- (7) You may receive communion inside or take it with you.

**Please do not come to church if you are feeling sick or exhibit any Covid-19 symptoms.



"First Impressions"

First impression is a moment in time when we form a "mental image" of an event that makes a significant impact in our lives. The book of Psalm 139: 13-14, is an impression from David about God's provision and care from the very beginning: "For you created my innermost

being; you knit me together in my mother's womb I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that fully well."

When I walked into the church for the first time, I noticed the welcome center, the beautiful stained-glass windows and the sanctuary. I am quite certain that first time visitors to Grace United Methodist Church carry that impression forward. We also convey that welcoming spirit for the people who drive by our church daily and how we care for our surroundings.

The idea of the "holy" seemed obvious to many people today. If that is all we have to lean on then it is essentially good for the spirit. Sometimes, we equate holiness with tall ceilings, beautiful icons, indescribable stained-glass creations and flickering candles. I just stand with awe and can't imagine the gift of these artists that inspires generations even to this day. The invitation in one of the folders that describes the history of a particular sacred place says, "These symbols push us out of the chaos of daily life and into deeper connection with God and one another."

In this unusual season of the Pandemic, many of us have not been in church since March 15, 2020 when everything closed for our wellness and safety. Imagine missing Easter, Mother's Day, Recognition of Graduates, receiving Confirmands, Father's Day and Pentecost. On top of that, we can't offer our sacred space for weddings, funerals and baptism.

This time away is temporary and is a way of saying, "Now we're in the presence of God." Our online services are now one way in which we can nurture our souls. In fact, the early church grew when people gathered in homes for prayer, scripture and word. People form an impression of the church by what we offer.

I have had three "cottage meetings" (meet and greet with the Pastor) and I know the challenge of not seeing each other's face because we have to wear a mask. But it is not a barrier, if the impression we leave behind convey our love for one another.

Thank you for the opportunity to meet with you in this way. Let us continue to do the work of Christ and in these challenging times, step up in faith, and push the chaos of our daily lives and lean on God who is faithful. That is the impression we have of God and worth sharing— "your works are wonderful; I know that fully well."
