

The Education Team has been very actively "optimizing" the Education wing during the month of July. We have removed broken or damaged furniture that could potentially cause harm. Tables and chairs were redistributed to more closely match the needs of the learners assigned to each classroom. Support furniture, instructional tools, and educational materials have been adjusted in their locations to increase the productivity of the teaching space. Our technology tools are in the process of being updated.

We are so very for all of the volunteers who have spent countless hours assisting in this transformation process. And yet the work continues... We will schedule another work day for Saturday, August 20, 2022 to work on decorating our classrooms and getting our materials in order to teach our Sunday School lessons. If youth or other adults need community service hours, please let me know!

In addition, our Education Team plans to set a monthly mission project for our children and youth as a way to share our faith and love for God with others. During the month of August, we are asking for donations to put together backpacks for children and youth in our conference who are homeless, in foster care settings, or are identified as at-risk from a socio-economic standpoint. The children and youth will build the backpack sets as part of the Rally Day / Homecoming Event on Sunday, September 11, 2022. You can either donate school supplies or donate money that will be used to order materials at a discount. All donations will be shared between our local mission sites with the remainder to be given to the Kids Above All non-profit organization which is a ministry through the Northern Illinois Conference of the United Methodist Church which supports nearly 1,000 children in our conference.
