"COME BEFORE WINTER"

As I write for Grace Notes, the temperature outside is frigid and the wind chill factor is below zero. I have tried unsuccessfully to explain to some of my friends in different parts of the world what winter is like in the Midwest. I often said that if they would like to visit, then "come before winter."

Paul wrote his last Epistle to Timothy urging him to come as soon as he is able. "Do your best to come before winter." He explains to Timothy his personal condition as his health was failing. He was in prison, a damp dungeon, and he longs for his cloak, his books and to see Timothy. Although many have deserted him, he urged that that it should not be counted against them.

Paul wrote that the Lord stood with him and strengthened him so that the Good News may continue to flourish. He greeted women and men along the journey who carried the message of Jesus Christ forward. In the midst of his own personal struggle, he sang a Doxology—"To him be the glory forever and ever. Amen."

We look forward to the singing of the birds, the bud forming from barren trees and the renewal of creation very soon. All of us have been affected by this Pandemic in a personal way. We have done things differently and adapt to the challenges before us and utilize the best practices available.

We continue to support the vital ministries of the church and staff. One of the church tellers, approached me one Sunday and said that "there were only a few of us today because of the inclement weather but the level of commitment is more than we have received in the past." I was thankful for that extravagant generosity, the gifts from the heart. This is only one pathway of our commit-

ment to God.

Paul addressed in his final letter the cost of following in the footsteps of Jesus Christ. He insisted that God is able and gives us his grace. "Make every effort to come to me soon."

Whether you are able to come and worship in person or remain at home to join the service on line, it remains our joyful presence. We invite God to make space in our lives. There are many opportunities to be a part of the work of God. And finally, Paul offered this benediction to

Timothy and to all of us: "The Lord be with your spirit. Grace be with you."

Notes:

- 1) Income for 2021 was within 0.5% of budget. Pledge income was down about \$17k and the amount received from the endowment fund was \$7k less than expected, but that was offset by an additional \$20k in PPP funds and \$3k in unbudgetted building rental.
- 2) Expenses for 2021 were nearly \$50k less than budget. Major contributors were: \$12k by not paying the general church portion of apportionment (conference portion was paid in full), \$24k from not have a full staff for the entire year, \$5k for not spending the full program budget, and \$5k by staying within the building maintenance budget.
- 3) Cash flow was positive by over \$28k, which provides a bit of a cushion at the start of what might be a challenging 2022.


