During Lent, let us recall the Psalm prayer of David: But I will sing of your strength, in the morning I will sing of your love; for you are my fortress, my refuge in times of trouble. (Psalm 59)

It is possible that Jesus offered this prayer also in addition to what he said —" I am the light of the world". 
May this season of Lent allow us to experience newness in the midst of changing times.





(Local Benevolences) Daybreak Shelter, Joliet

Daybreak Shelter operates 24 hours a day, 365 days a year and provides emergency housing and supportive services to individuals and families who are homeless. Some participants in the program are in need of short -term housing, as a result of a situational crisis. Others need support services as the work to reestablish permanent housing. Homelessness prevention services are also provided to individuals and families who are at risk of losing their homes.

Families and individuals served continued to rise as 2022 progressed 58% of operating income in 2022 from Joliet grants, TANF & ESFP 27% of operating income from the churches that operate the pantry 12% of operating income from individual donors 3% of operating income from other sources 89% of operating expenses in 2022 spent for food and diapers 11% of operating expenses spent for building use, supplies & services

- 1) Although cash flow was negative for the year, we have been notified through the food bank that beginning next month we are likely to see more grant funding for food via grants from the latest American Rescue Plan Act, which we be helpful for 2023.
- 2) The Trinity Church building is now on the market so the pantry will have to move in the relatively near future. The pantry board is looking but hasn't yet found a suitable location in the area.
