Thursday, June 29th at Central Park Band Shell in Naperville - Annu-

If you like concert bands and patriotic music, you don't want to miss this one. This concert is incredibly packed full – starting early in the day folks get their lawn chairs and blankets set out. I would be happy to meet people at 4pm to carpool and drive together and find parking (meet at Home Run Inn parking lot at Boughton and Weber Road). Wednesday, August 16<sup>th</sup> at Bolingbrook Performing Arts Center at Briarcliff and Delaware (town center near post office, village hall) - Classical Blast - Bach to Rock; 7:30pm. Space will try to be saved on the lower part of the hill (bring your own chairs) or you can sit in the plastic chairs provided on the blacktop area. It is advisable to be there by 6:45-7pm. Concession stand (food and drinks) is on site, or you may bring your own food/cooler. Parking can be found off Delaware in the Pace Bus parking lot across street from hill/stage area, or off Briarcliff in the Village Hall parking lot (walk through tunnel to get behind Village Hall to the stage area). The 184th session of the Northern Illinois Annual Conference is set to take place June 6th – June 8th, 2023. The Conference will return to the Renaissance Schaumburg Convention Center at 1551 N. Thoreau Dr., Schaumburg, IL, again this year. Continuing with the theme, "Connected in Christ"; the 2023 theme is "Connected in Christ: Come to the Table," placing the focus on one of the core elements of our Christian faith: the sacrament of com-

munion. Communion brings us into the real presence of Christ on a regular basis.

As we join at the table, we are nourished so that we might bring Christ into the world, ultimately forming community, from baptism to the communion table. By participating in communion and becoming a community, we are called in ministry and mission.

This theme allows us to go outside of the temporal issues of the world into a deeper theological reflection and ideology of God's grace offered to us while also calling us into action. The scriptural grounding for this year's theme is Luke 11:3, "Give us each day OUR daily bread." Bishop Dan Schwerin will preside and preach at the ordination service on Luke 11:1-8.

Grace Church will be represented by Jim Morrow and Diane Morrow. Let us pray for a successful "Holy Conferencing" and renew our commitment as a church in connection locally and globally.

After being shutdown for 5 weeks following the sale of the Trinity UMC building, the Ridgewood United Community Pantry reopened on May 10th in a new location (an unmanned fire station) about 3 blocks away. These photos were taken on May 17th while the team from Grace UMC was serving. At the new location we have less space inside for food storage and to fill boxes.
