

An ensemble of women sang "Via Dolorosa" to different gatherings especially during the season of Lent. All they had was a passion for music, an accompaniment tape and a portable sound system. My role was to hit the play button, adjust the volume and make sure the two microphones were properly plugged in. Their musical offerings were well received and the finale was the song "Via Dolorosa" popularized by Sandi Patti.

"Via Dolorosa" often translated as "Way of Suffering" is a processional route in the Old City of Jerusalem. Today pilgrims walk the route, reciting prayers along specific stops and a cross that leads the group forward. Traditions says that the path was used by Jesus, forced to march by the Roman Soldiers, on the way to Golgotha, where Jesus died on the cross. The winding route through old cobbled stones started from the place where Jesus was tried for high treason.

The charge was the claim, "King of the Jews", although Jesus did not claim this title for himself. According to biblical sources a "cohort" which may consist of 300 to 600 Roman soldiers were assembled to further humiliate Jesus. Up to now, I cannot bear the thought of Jesus' physical suffering. It is no wonder that the disciples urged Jesus not to proceed to Jerusalem because of this.

There are two scriptures that come to mind during Lent. One is from John 3:16, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, so whoever believeth in him, will not perish but may have eternal life." The other is from Romans 5:8, "God proves his love for us that while we were yet sinners Christ died for us."

We have witnessed so much suffering in the world today. The Good News still resonates today and emerging to bring hope to the world. In the parsonage backyard, the crocuses are slightly visible and defying the frost of late winter. Surely there is suffering that all of us may in one form or another endure, but God has the final word.

The lyrics of the song "Via Dolorosa" says, "But He chose to walk that road out of His love for you and me." Let us continue to journey together as a church because the story of God's redeeming love is a story repeated in ordinary moments of our lives.


LENTEN STUDY PRAYER IN THE NIGHT

The North Central Jurisdiction office is charged with resourcing individuals, teams, leaders and UMVIM projects within the jurisdiction. The office maintains a future teams list, sends out e-newsletters and maintains the National Project List. It also assists in Emergency Response Training (ERT) and VIM leader training.

SHOE DRIVE has ended. Thank you to everyone who supported our 'Shoe Drive'. The drive is officially over. Back in early February we sent out 78 bags of shoes! Each bag holds 25 pair of shoes. Many of the shoes that we collected are shipped to Haiti (mostly), Honduras, Guatemala, Botswana, Cambodia, and other third world countries.
