

H.I.S. Home For Children is a U.S. registered orphanage located at Delmas 33, Rue Charbonnieres #123, Port-Au-Prince, Haiti.

MILK MONEY

In Haiti it is often physically and financially difficult to get some of the most basic things that are used to care for the health and welfare of children, things such as cloth diapers, shampoo, milk and baby formula. There is always a need for powdered infant formula as babies in Haiti are literally starving due to lack of food, and while formula, as an item that is necessary

for children, it is also significantly more costly in Haiti.

The children are also in need of donations of oral antibiotics, fever reducers, cough medicine and vitamins.

CHILD SPONSORSHIPS

At H.I.S Home For Children they realize that adoption is not right for everyone. If you desire to help needy children but feel that adop-

tion is not a viable option for you, the sponsorship program is a wonderful way to do so. For a small monthly donation, you can help make a difference in a child's life. This monthly gift will cover the costs of food, teachers, staff, nannies, educational supplies and medical treatments for a child in need.

JOB TRAINING

H.I.S. Home also provides nanny training that is open to locals who pay \$50 Haitian (.50¢ USD) to attend and receive a full refund upon completion of the training. The graduates are given a certificate that is then honored at many other Haitian orphanages.



MISSION TRIPS

Teams coming to provide hands-on maintenance at our four houses. (Typically Haitian houses are rented/ paid on an annual basis with the renter responsible for maintaining the property.)

 We usually have broken bikes or other projects.
- Medical for example, Physical Therapists Our Special Needs home will keep you busy!

• Missional ministry students who want to come and explore what the Gospel means in a place like Port-au-Prince.

On March 4 a group will travel to HIS Home in Port-au-Prince, Haiti as a mission outreach of Grace UMC. The group going is Meredith Schroeder, Steve Meister, Jason Meister, and Stephanie Meister. They will working with the orphanage. They are looking for donations to take baby formula (the

Walmart brand) and other supplies for the children. Checks can be made out to Grace UMC with a note in the memo of "Haiti Trip". Also donations will be accepted to offset the airfares for our college student going.

H.I.S. Home will probably not have fresh paint, high water pressure, and perhaps not even electricity at times when you are there. However, the nursery does get a bacterial cleaning every day; the clothes are washed daily; and all of the children get three hearty meals and regular interaction with the nannies and staff day and night. And all of our children have shoes. (They just don't like wearing them!)

CERTIFY YOUR BACKYARD

One of Grace Church's very own—Russ Ghilain, has a certified backyard through the Illinois Audubon Society. Your yard must have plantings especially suited to attracting birds and butterflies and provide the four basic elements of habitat: Food, Shelter, Water and Space. This may include trees and shrubs to provide nesting cover for birds, berry-producing shrubs, flowers for hummingbirds and butterflies, plants grown specifically for bees and caterpillars. It may also include nest boxes if there is space, and should have a birdbath, small pond or other source of water.




Come and SEE!
