Lifeway Research has offered this interesting survey: 79% of people unchurched agree with this statement, "If a friend of mine really values their faith, I don't mind them talking about it." While this is not specifically about "prayer", most often our conversation especially during difficult times revolves around the value of being connected with one another and ultimately with God. During Lent, we model an effort to offer a sacred space in words and in practice.

How do we do that? We offer spoken prayer when possible or simply being present is prayer in itself. Through the years I have received prayer requests

for the ordinary challenges that we face to the deep longings of the heart. There are times that prayer can become a cliche as in "you are in my thoughts and prayer."

Maybe this is the reason why Jesus in Matthew 6:5 offered this view, "And when you pray do not be like the hypocrites, for

they love to pray standing and on the street corners to be seen by others; Mark 12:38, "They like to walk around in flowing robes and be greeted with respect.." Jesus was offering another way to pray. I can of course identify with "wearing long robes" and "standing" as this is the pattern during worship. I may also offer long prayers from time to time!

In confirmation class we teach the basic pattern of prayer using the acronym ACTS: Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving and Supplication. But I like what one author offered and easier to grasp: Wow, Help and Thanks. But when we pray, whether it is spontaneous or what we have been given by the church, we pray beyond what we can know and leave it there for God to sort out. It is our belief that God will respond according to His purposes.

We approach God not only with our strengths, but in our weaknesses. This is where our faith becomes our resource. Remember what Paul shared, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." (2 Corinthians 12:9)

Jesus pulls us away from weariness and offers us rest. This is prayer. There is plenty to be upset about, plenty of loss to mourn, plenty to lament and you can add to the growing list.

When I was in the University and unable to attend regular worship service for two years because

of the requirement to serve in the ROTC (Reserve Officer Training Course) I missed the rhythm of the church. Then I discovered about a Vesper service and how I was refreshed spiritually. I met friends and developed a passion for serving the church.



During this season of Lent, as we pray

for the church, the world and our Grace community, may we rediscover that faith comes as a gift and we cannot keep it for ourselves. Soon, the first flowers of spring, the Crocuses, will emerge and remind us that there is a path forward. I read that it is also called the "light bulb" flower because of its shape until it fully blooms.

Prayer is an expression of grace that we can practice. Sometimes we are gifted with the right words; other times we lean on the prayers handed down through the rich history of the church or as in most cases being present is prayer itself.

May God bless the Church and bring us to healing and wholeness in God's perfect timing.
