On May 24, 1738, John Wesley attended a worship service or group meeting in Aldersgate Street in London. He wrote that "his heart was strangely warmed" and he experienced an assurance of his own salvation. This was a turning point for John Wesley and the Methodist movement in Britain and America. John Wesley was a parish priest but his preaching attracted a lot of attention, including his superiors who deemed that his preaching was too "radical". Thus he found himself without a "parish." English churches were organized around parishes and protected by established decorum.

Later on the phrase "The world is my parish" became synonymous with the invitation to preach the Good News to all. Wesley "moved" the Gospel in coal mines, city corners, hospitals, town halls and other venues.

I had the privilege to visit the Wesley Chapel in London and walked in the parsonage beside the chapel. Worship life was central to John Wesley and in his room there was an adjoining room that he used as a private chapel. His brother Charles, also shaped the development of the Methodist movement by using hymns to connect us with God. Charles Wesley's organ was also in display where he composed many beautiful hymns we still sing today for worship.

What is worship? Why is it central to our faith? Worship is our approach to God and offering what is pleasing in God's sight. Through the year's worship speaks to the new generation of believers. This sort of thing happens when God meets us in a particular place. It can be anywhere, the beauty of nature as spring flower emerges, in the busy intersection when we are stuck in traffic, in quiet places where we seek refuge or even in places where life and death intersects. When God meets us, God leaves an imprint in our lives.

The month of May prepares us for the next season in Pentecost. May 28, 2023 is Pentecost Sunday with ONE SERVICE at 9:30 a.m. We will continue to offer worship that is pleasing to God and share our many unique gifts during the summer months.

In the mean time we will have Mother's Day, Baptism, Confirmation, Memorial Day and please check the rest of our announcements in Grace Notes. You may always call the *Church Office, Prayer Ministry Team* for sharing joys and concerns. We also give thanks for our *Music Ministry, our Sunday School parents and teachers, and Mission Ministry partners*.

#### Important information regarding Northern Illinois Conference and Boy Scouts of America

Grace Church has supported out local Boy Scout Troop for many years and have appreciated the partnership developed. It is a vital ministry. However, in December 2022, Grace Church was not able to extend its chartering agreement with the Boy Scouts. It was a sad decision. The local Troop found another church who offered safe space and chartering responsibilities.

The decision was complicated and you will find in this Grace Notes the rationale for this action. We followed the directive of the Conference to offer a space sharing agreement but NOT chartering the Boy Scouts because of insurance liabilities and many unanswered questions. We still support and affirm our youth involved in Scouting.

The lawsuit and the corresponding settlement was due to Sexual Abuse of Children and Youth for a specific period of years. Let me assure you that there was no record of Sexual Abuse of Children at Grace Church. We have a Safe Sanctuary Policy in place.

Part of the settlement involve compensation for victims of sexual abuse survivors. The details are in the news article that we have received from the conference. Our Church Council is aware of the settlement and advise the Church how to contribute to this fund. All churches in the Conference, whether the church has chartered Boys Scouts in the past or in some other supportive relationship are now being asked to consider supporting this fund.

We are praying for the church for the healing and reconciliation of God's beloved children. God bless, Pastor Romir



# Cathy Boswell Set For Induction Into Women's Basketball Hall of Fame

**KNOXVILLE, Tenn.** – It has been nearly six months since Illinois State women's basketball great Cathy Boswell learned that she had earned a spot among women's college basketball's all-time greats as a member of the 2023 Women's Basketball Hall of Fame Class.

That long wait comes to an end Saturday, when the 2023 Women's Basketball Hall of Fame Class will officially be inducted during the 24th WBHOF Induction Ceremony.

This year's Women's Basketball Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony will be broadcasted live at 5 p.m. CT on ESPN3, which can be found at the link above.

ESPNU will also carry a rebroadcasting of this year's ceremony on the following days and times: May 2 at 7:30 p.m. CT, May 4 at 4:00 p.m. CT, May 6 at 4:00 p.m. CT, and May 7 at 6 p.m. CT.

Cathy Boswell (1979-83) was a two-time WBCA Kodak All-American and two-time Wade Trophy finalist during her time at ISU, finishing her collegiate career with 2,005 points and 1,054 rebounds. She led the Redbirds to 90 wins, an NCAA Tournament berth in 1983, a 15th-place finish in the AlAW National Tournament in 1981 and two WNIT bids (1980 and 1982).

Following her illustrious collegiate career, Boswell was a member of the 1984 women's Olympic gold medalist USA basketball team and competed internationally for 14 years, earning seven team most valuable player awards, one league MVP title, a player of the year award and five league championships.


