

World Communion Sunday is October 4, 2020 and we will be serving communion by way of "Drive-thru" from 11:30 a.m. to 12: 15 p.m. Our ushers in the parking lot will greet and direct you in front of the church. Some of these alternative practices, like "Love Feast" on line and "Holy Communion drive thru" do not diminish this important Christian practice as long as the elements are received in thanksgiving for what God is able to do.

You may be sitting in your car or in your own home and what you hold in your hands are visible reminders of God's presence. Our usual practice is to break a loaf of bread and pieces of bread are given out. "The Lord Jesus on the night he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is given for you, do this in remembrance of me." Simple bread and yet it connects us with the holiness of God.

After supper, Jesus "took the cup saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood, do this, whenever, you drink it, in remembrance of me." Jesus connected his life to ours and he quenched the longing of our souls.

In the United Methodist Church, we lift up this Sunday to support World Communion Scholarships for developing and training emerging church leaders. You may designate your special offering to World Communion Sunday.

A friend of mine who was a recipient of this scholarship is now the President of Harris Memorial College, started by American missionaries. The school is a pioneer in Kindergarten and Christian Education. There are many serving in the different parts of the world. What scholars receive are given back to the Church for a lifetime of service. Imagine the scope of your offering and prayer.

As you leave Grace Church, there is a banner that proclaims, "Greet each one as if they are Christ." I humbly realized that people don't come to church because we have the most polished service, beautiful voices and life changing programs—it's all about equipping one another and stepping up in faith.

Facebook Live on September 6th at 9:30am for the virtual service with our Grace family. Following the service, Pastor Romir will serve **Holy Communion** in a drive-by fashion in the church parking lot from **11am** – **11:30am**.

If you are unable to join us on Sunday, please call the church office to arrange a time to pick up baggies with communion elements and the liturgy. We are also willing to deliver communion sets to you - especially if you are unable to travel, sick, self-isolating or are oth-

erwise uncomfortable for any reason to come in person. Pastor Romir is willing to come to you.

Pastor Romir will set up an altar like "station" at the main entrance of the church. He will be distributing individually packaged communion wafer and juice cup sets to all. Our communion elements will be blessed prior to distribution in that hour, so there is no need to "come early" for that part. The elements will be handed to each driver in a ziploc bag that will contain the liturgy, scripture and closing prayer plus the individual communion sets.

Please follow the driving direction on the map below to ensure a safe traffic pattern for everyone. Cars will only enter from Westminster into the far end of the church parking lot. Ushers will be outside to help direct traffic. After receiving communion near the main entrance, cars will be directed to leave the parking lot via Avalon.
