### "Rooted in Grace"

So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in him, <sup>7</sup> rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness. (Colossians 2:6-7)

Many of you are praying for the mission and ministry of Grace United Methodist Church. We have a rich history and it shows in our daily practice of faith. I invite you to look at the bulletin board with pictures, past activities and the brief history of the church to provide some context where we have been and the opportunities for today. The board is located in the corner leading to the Sunday School wing. Can you find yourself in the picture? Can you identify some of the people in the activity pages?

Last week we engaged in a conversation as part our strategic plan for the next 3 to 5 years. Pastor Nancy was generous in her time as she co-leads this conversation. We claimed the scripture passage from Paul's letter to the Colossians so that we are *rooted in him, strengthened in the faith and overflowing with thankfulness*. We are moving in the direction that we are "*Rooted in Grace*." The grace of God in Jesus Christ is richly given to all of us.

We will be asking questions, forming small groups and connect with one another so that our expressions of faith will be firmly rooted in Jesus, the source of all grace. We have identified three areas that will help us to move forward with confidence and hope.

The three areas are: Digital Ministry, Missional Presence and Generosity.

Each area will complement one another. I used the word "alignment" as a way of moving us forward. For example, *Digital Ministry* will address our worship needs & also celebrate our talents and gifts for music. *Missional presence* is allowing us to open new doors so people can serve uniquely. The ongoing needs of maintaining a church facility is crucial. *Generosity* is taking a look at our commitment in prayer, presence, gifts, service and witness.

This a broad outline and we will get there in the fulness of time. But this is our common work. My impression is that we have not done this before. As we re-engage the church, in the post-pandemic, let us fully trust and invest in the faith we have received so that we can overflow with thankfulness.

Let us be rooted in grace.
