

# WHAT ARE YOU DOING DURING THE STAY-AT-HOME TIME?

Since many of our artistic events are canceled and galleries are closed, we will look at what some of our members are doing during this down time...

LAURIE HEIN: "Last summer I took a trip for 90 days to many of the National Parks on the West Coast and Midwest. It was a trip of a lifetime. I plein air painted at several of the parks and did 20 paintings. I also did a workshop for five days at the Grand Canyon with Mitch Baird when I was awarded by Oil Painters of America. They had a contest to write an essay on why you wanted to win a plein-air workshop. The winner would win a plein-air workshop from a list of workshops. I won! It was a terrific way to get more familiar with plein-air painting with great instruction and tips.

"Now with the Coronavirus isolation, I decided to challenge myself and whoever wanted to join me to a 30 painting or 30 day, one hour (give or take) painting per day and chose a theme.... I am on painting number 10 and having the time of my painting life remembering the great trip I had while doing the paintings. The end results will be posted on my website on Paint the Parks to raise money for our National Parks. I challenge other artists in our group to choose a subject and let their art make a difference in this time of difficulties. I am posting regularly on my Instagram and Facebook account to show progress during the painting process. Maybe someone would like to watch or join in."
