PAWNEE BUTTES® sandcherry
A colorful, low-growing beauty

## PAWNEE BUTTES® sandcherry

(*Prunus besseyi* 'P011S') is a graceful, low-growing form of our native sandcherry shrub. It thrives

at a variety of elevations.

Fragrant, white flowers attract pollinators in April. By summer, this low-growing shrub is covered with vibrant, green leaves and can produce black fruit that's attractive to birds. The lustrous, green leaves turn red hues in the fall.

PAWNEE BUTTES® is a native selection—a plant found in the wild that was selected for unique, naturally-occurring traits. It grows just 15–18 inches tall. (Most sandcherries grow five to six feet tall.)

Tips from the pros: Give it plenty of room to grow horizontally. Occasional hand pruning of small limbs will keep this well-behaved plant in a beautiful shape.



## Get plant details

Botanical name note: *Prunus besseyi* is a synonym for *Prunus pumila* var. *besseyi*.

## Your plant questions... answered!









#### "Should I fertilize Plant Select shrubs?"

Generally, no. These plants should be able to access the nutrients they need in our soils. They're adapted to western conditions. Less work for you!

It can be tempting to push young shrubs to grow faster or to empty out fertilizer bottles (intended for annual flowers) before fall, but promoting tender, new growth on your shrubs at this time of year can make them vulnerable to freezing.

If you're trying to boost the health of a shrub, particularly a young shrub getting established, water it well this fall—and water it through drier winters.




