### Program Updates from SSVF at UVM:

- SSVF at UVM successfully completed the COA Accreditation process! We completed the accreditation process with an expedited approval. We are now accredited through April 2030.
- SSVF at UVM had an 89% success rate for exiting Veterans. This means that 89% of exited Veterans in Q2 of FY26 had permanent housing at exit.
- SSVF at UVM has an MOU in place with the VA HUD-VASH program to work with Veterans for Collaborative Case Management with their HUD-VASH Case Manager. If you know of a Veteran with a HUD-VASH voucher looking for housing, we may be able to help. Have their HUD-VASH Case Manager reach out the the SSVF at UVM program.

### Did you know?

The goal of the SSVF grant is to advance housing stability services to low-income Veteran families who are experiencing homelessness or at imminent risk of experiencing homelessness. A combination of rapid re-housing and homelessness prevention services offers Veterans a wide range of opportunities to secure and retain permanent housing.
