Program Updates from SSVF at UVM:

- Welcome to our new Northern Vermont Housing Service Coordinator, Johnathan Ruiz!
- Supportive Services for Veteran Families at the University of Vermont is currently hiring for a Southern Vermont Housing Service Coordinator. If interested, please go to <https://www.uvmjobs.com/postings/72544>
- Supportive Services for Veteran Families at the University of Vermont has raised the income eligibility to 80% AMI. Veteran households can now meet income eligibility with up to 80% AMI for the area where they are residing. This will allow SSVF to serve a broader population of Veterans in need.
- SSVF at UVM is implementing the use of Landlord and Veteran Incentives. These incentives are intended to help house the Veterans with the most barriers to stable permanent housing and to address quality of life for the Veterans housed, offering comforts most people expect in their homes.
- SSVF at UVM has space available for eligible Veterans who enroll in SSVF to be referred to our SSVF Shallow Subsidy Service. SSVF at UVM Shallow Subsidy can support 50% of rental payments for up to two years to help Veterans become stable in permanent housing.
