Program Updates from SSVF at UVM:

- SSVF at UVM has successfully transitioned 7 clients to Shallow Subsidy as of the end of Q3. The SSVF Shallow Subsidy service provides two years of rental assistance to very low-income and extremely low-income Veteran households who are enrolled in SSVF's Rapid Rehousing or Homeless Prevention projects. Under Shallow Subsidy service, payment of 50% of the contracted rent is paid directly to the landlord. Community based services are provided to the Veteran throughout the enrollment, and there is a dedicated point of contact for landlords. SSVF at UVM has more capacity in the Shallow Subsidy service, and looks forward to working with more Veterans on the path to stable, permanent housing.
- SSVF at UVM has hired a Health Care Navigator for Southern Vermont. SSVF at UVM is happy to introduce Tim Poulin who will be working with Veterans in Southern Vermont to meet their Health Care and medical needs.
- SSVF at UVM is still hiring for a Program Assistant based at our UVM office on Water Tower Circle in Colchester. If you are interested in this position, please click on the following links to apply directly in the UVM Jobs website:

Successes Q3:

- The percent of successful exits rose to 60% for Q3. Out of the unsuccessful exits, one Veteran entered GPD and one Veteran exited to incarceration. Accounting for this, the success rate would have been as high as 70% if taking into consideration factors beyond the case managers control.
- Health Care Navigation Services were provided for 32 Veterans in Q3, with 15 newly enrolled. 4 Veterans were connected to VA Healthcare, 1 Veteran newly enrolled in other medical benefits, and 2 Veterans established a Primary Care Physician.
