Program Updates from SSVF at UVM:

- SSVF at UVM had an overall satisfaction rating score of 4.74 out of 5.0 for FY23. This is based on the responses rate of 49% overall for all Veterans eligible for the 45-60 day satisfaction survey.
- SSVF at UVM provided rental assistance, security deposit assistance and/or arrear payments for 71 unique Veteran clients in FY23 resulting in the prevention or resolution of homelessness.
- Supportive Services for Veteran Families at the University of Vermont has raised the income eligibility to 80% AMI. Veteran households can now meet income eligibility with up to 80% AMI for the area where they are residing. This will allow SSVF to serve a broader population of Veterans in need.
- Beginning in FY24, SSVF at UVM is implementing the use of Landlord and Veteran Incentives. These incentives are intended to help house the Veterans with the most barriers to stable permanent housing and to address quality of life for the Veterans housed, offering comforts most people expect in their homes.
