Nicodemus - Children of the Promised Land - On July 14, 2024, AAPS hosted a presentation by Angela Bates, executive director and past president of the Nicodemus Historical Society. It was a wonderful presentation that explored the history of a town in



Graham County KS where African American homesteaders came after the Civil War to live as free citizens.

Within the context of settling in the West at the end of Reconstruction, Angela shared the dynamics of mothers and their children after slavery, stories of



children who were conceived in slavery but born free, and the contrast of life and decisions based on the simple concept of "choice," which freedom, at last, afforded. She also shared current day activities alive and well in Nicodemus. Thanks Angela! AAPS was open during the summer season each Sunday, and provided a cool place to view this year's theme "Women of Kansas History". Ninety visits were logged for the summer season! The 3 women governors who have (and one who is currently serving) were highlighted along with local women leaders from our area and famous movie and sports figures. Deborah Rose, our local leader was kind enough to lend memorabilia from her career to display. She became the highest-ranking female in the Kansas National Guard when she was promoted to the rank of colonel in 2002, and upon her promotion to brigadier general in 2007 was also the first female to achieve that rank in the Kansas National Guard.
