



Al in Plain Language

Generative AI can draft text and summarize info. It can brainstorm ideas and translate languages.

Why It Matters

Al boosts productivity, with ~66% more output on tasks (<u>nngroup.com</u>). Get more time for what counts.

Blurring the Lines

- Environmental impact








Case Study: Microsoft Copilot for Essay Scoring

Following these steps helps create effective prompts for AI essay scoring, ensuring consistent and meaningful results.

Results & Takeaways



Consistent Alignment

Copilot's scores consistently aligned with human reviews.



Predictable Decisions

No "rogue Al" surprises—decisions were reliable.



Performance Improvement

My feedback enhanced its performance over time.



Scalable Approach

Personal Statement Evaluation

Score: 18

Rationale:

- The applicant clearly outlines their intention to study at Northeastern's London Campus and provides a compelling link between the global experience and their academic, professional, and personal goals.
- They highlight specific plans to take Statics and Thermodynamics as co-requisites, which are not typically
 available on the Boston campus, and how this will position them for higher career opportunities in
 aerospace engineering.
- The essay demonstrates a strong understanding of how the experience will benefit them both academically
 and professionally, with a clear articulation of personal growth and professional development.

Diversity and Inclusion Statement Evaluation


Score: 17

Rationale:

- The applicant effectively discusses their interest in understanding how race and ethnicity are experienced in the UK and how this will provide new perspectives on systemic inequalities.
- They highlight their commitment to promoting diversity and inclusion, which aligns well with Northeastern's goal of building diverse and inclusive global networks.
- The essay provides a strong personal narrative that demonstrates a clear commitment to exploring and celebrating diversity. However, it could benefit from more specific examples of how they plan to engage with and support diverse communities during their time in London.

Composite Score: 17.5

The applicant has provided well-thought-out essays that align closely with the evaluation rubric. Their clear articulation of goals and plans, along with their commitment to diversity and inclusion, make them a strong candidate for the "Summer In" program.





The Problem

Lessons Learned - Making Al Work for You

1 Al = Collaborator

Treat generative AI as a coworker who needs guidance. Refine its drafts and trust your judgment.

3 Iterate & Refine

Don't be afraid to tweak prompts. Refine your questions, and try again for enhanced output.

2 Good Prompts = Good Results

The clearer your directions, the better the output. Provide context for better results.

4 Stay Ethical

Avoid sensitive student data. Fact-check everything, as Al can make mistakes.
