## **MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR**

In writing this foreword, I reflect on how much the staff and volunteers have achieved on behalf of unpaid carers in Northumberland during 2024/25.

In reflecting on the past year, it is poignant to remember that we learnt of the very sad news of the death of Peter Stonell, who was a much loved and respected Trustee and Treasurer for many years. We are grateful for his support and his service to the organisation.

However, we also have much to celebrate and to be proud of. The small staff team go above and beyond and continue to deliver life-changing support to unpaid carers in Northumberland. Special thanks are also given to our fabulous volunteers who dedicate their time and support as group hosts, activity assistants and Board trustees.

Collectively, the team have continued to provide a huge amount of support to an ever-increasing number of unpaid carers across the county. The excellent feedback received demonstrates the transformational support provided, and the real difference our staff make to carers on a daily basis.

During 2024/25, we have continued to see a significant rise in the number of new registered carers, alongside an increased complexity of enquiries. The team have delivered significant levels of training for professionals and carers, and their work has generated a very large increase in financial benefit gains, and grants for individual unpaid carers.

All of this is made possible by the exceptional leadership of Debra Blakey, our CEO over the past 7 years.

Given the continued rise in the number of unpaid carers in Northumberland, the task of making sure carers are recognised, valued and supported doesn't stop.

On behalf of my fellow Trustees, thank you to our staff, our volunteers and all our partners, supporters, and funders.




## YEAR IN REVIEW

On 31 March 2025, there were 8959 carers registered (this includes 879 parent carers and 656 young carers). Since 1 April 24, 1124 new adult carers have been registered, and 195 new young carers have been registered.


In 2024/2025 we supported 3792 people and undertook 17316 actions on their behalf.







#### **WORKING FOR CARERS**

The Working For Carers project began on 1 April 2024 in partnership with Newcastle Carers and North Tyneside Carers' Centre it aims to support carers to move towards employment, training, and education, as well as supporting carers who are in work to sustain and achieve employment career progression. The project is funded by the North East Combined Authority and also aims to support employers across the North of Tyne to have a greater awareness of employees who may having caring responsibilities and how to help support them to remain in work. The project engaged over 300 carers throughout the year and connected with 196 organisations in the North of Tyne region

## **ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS**

We run 9 regular carer groups across the county, offering peer support and a chance for carers to take a break. In addition to this we have organised meals, walks, activities and trips throughout the year.

Our second annual Beamish trip had nearly 150 attendees!

#### SCHOOLS WORK

have a comprehensive offer to schools to help them to identify and support young carers in education. Our schools programme offers young carer awareness training to all school staff, young carer themed assemblies, support with implementing a Young Carer Policy, and group work in schools.

Our School Award has seen 7 schools achieve gold, 3 silver and 18 bronze, with over 60 schools currently taking part in the School Award.

Training has been provided to staff to equip them to be better able to identify young carers. Parents evenings and assemblies have allowed young people to identify themselves as young carers too

#### **ACTIVITIES**

Our young carer activity programme has been able to continue thanks to a generous ongoing private donation. Activities this year have included, Kirkley Hall Zoo, Whickham Thorns, Bowling, Boxing, Paddleboarding, Ice Skating, Lilidorei, and an exciting 2-night residential trip to Peat Rigg Outdoor Activity Centre in Yorkshire where we were joined by young carers from Newcastle and Hartlepool.

416 young carers attended activities and events this year, an increase of 28% from 2023-24.

Young carers have been amazing for my son. His confidence and independence has grown, and he loves spending time with all the staff at young carers. He is beginning to build friendships too which is so lovely to see.



## **TRAINING**

**Training for carers** – there is a programme of regular carer workshops to support wellbeing through the year being delivered both remotely via Zoom and in-person. Carers have attended sessions on Lasting Power of Attorney, rare dementia, scam awareness, managing guilt, and caring for someone with dementia, paying for social care and stress management.

## **GOING FORWARD**

2024-25 has been another fast-paced year for Carers Northumberland, and we have seen growth across all of the services we offer. Our registrations, contacts and actions have increased year-on-year, and the number of carers supported has increased by 17% in 2024-25 from the previous year. We have funded (via our reserves) additional capacity in the Information and Advice Team which has enabled us to manage the increased demand on our service. This shows in the amount of annualised benefit gains we have secured for carers which has increased by a huge 94% from 2023-25 to just under £800,000.


Our work in the community will be continuing into the next financial year, this has given some of those carers who are not confident speaking on the telephone a much needed opportunity to be seen in person. We have also increased the number of trips and activities we provide for both carers and families – this has been possible due to an increase in general fundraising, early results from our recent survey have indicated that this is something that carers value and want more of.

As the funding landscape changes, we will be involved in more collaborative work both locally and regionally. We have already been working with our North of Tyne counterparts for many years, but with the establishment of both the North East Combined Authority, and the North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Systems we are now involved in more regional partnerships with other carer centres, with the aim of bringing more targeted support and consistency to all our services for adult, parent and young carers.

As always, our thanks go to our funders, our dedicated Trustee Board, staff team and volunteers for ensuring the ongoing success of Carers Northumberland.
