Message from the Chair

In my second year as Chair of the Board of Trustees for Carers Northumberland, I am delighted to introduce this Annual Report, which provides an overview of some of the achievements of the team. The report demonstrates the level of commitment, passion and hard work by our wonderful staff to improve the lives of unpaid carers across the county.

The team have seen a significant increase in both the number of registered carers, and the level of carer contacts and actions, and have continued to support carers, who consistently report very high levels of satisfaction about the support they have received. The 83% increase on the amount of annual benefit gains is remarkable, as is the level of training and support offered to other organisations, and the range of events and activities delivered across the county by the team.

One particular noteworthy achievement is being awarded the Improving Quality Foundation Standard in May 2023, which is an award for the not-for-profit sector that defines and recognises good practice. The award was given following a robust external assessment, review of evidence submitted and interviews with staff and trustees. The report noted a number of strengths, including the staff and volunteer team, the diversity of services offered, and good governance arrangements.

On behalf of the Board of Trustees, I would like to offer thanks and appreciation to our small team of volunteers and staff who work tirelessly to ensure unpaid carers in Northumberland have access to the information, advice and support they need. We are also grateful for all the funding streams from commissioners and other smaller funders, which make this work possible.

During 2023/24, three Trustees (Anne Arter, Ang De'Travernent and Julie Birkin-Nicholl) retired from the Board, and I would like to extend my thanks for their previous contribution and service to the organisation.

Finally, I would like to thank Debra, our Chief Executive, for her exceptional leadership in managing and supporting the team to deliver such a fantastic level of service. - *Julie Danskin, Chair of the Board of Trustees*




Registrations by month









Outreach Pilot

Our community outreach pilot has sessions running in Rothbury, Belford, Wooler, Alnwick, Bellingham, Prudhoe, Haltwhistle, Hexham, Ponteland, Blyth, Amble, Morpeth, Bedlington, Ashington, Cramlington, and Newbiggin by the Sea

We aim to make our information and advice service more accesible using outreach sessions, targeting carers who would not usually

access our services.

There are currently 14 carers being supported on this project in Northumberland, with 74 carers in Northumberland having been supported since the start of the project. This project ended on 31 March 2024; however, the partnership of Carers Northumberland, North Tyneside Carers Centre, and Newcastle Carers have secured a 12-month grant from the North of Tyne Combined Authority to upscale some of the elements from the Carers into Work project to include in-work support and employer engagement work.

The new project, Working for Carers, will begin on 1 April 2024





I felt listened to by the staff / volunteers at Carers



Going forward

2023-24 has been a bumper year for Carers Northumberland. We have seen an increase in registrations, contacts, and actions, and more notably, the amount of benefit gains we have secured on behalf of carers which has increased by a whopping 83% from 2022-23. This has been made possible by adding some additional capacity and resources to the team. We have expanded our Information Team with an extra Carer Information and Advice Worker, and the whole team has been supported by our Business Administration Apprentice, who we are pleased to say will be joining the team permanently later this year.


Our targeted outreach pilot started in October, and the team now has a regular presence at around 18 venues across the county. We will be evaluating the success of this pilot later in 2024, but what it has shown us already is that there is a need for our team to get out and about across the county to ensure that carers are able to access our services in a way that suits them.

Our Young Carer Service goes from strength to strength and the work that is being done with schools is ensuring that young carers are identified and able to seek support as soon as possible. Our aim is to expand our school work, and our one-to-one service for young carers in the coming year.

We're also looking forward to the new North East Combined Authority funded collaboration with Newcastle Carers and North Tyneside Carers' Centre, Working for Carers, which will support carers to access employment, training, education and volunteering opportunities, as well as supporting carers who are already in employment to sustain and progress in their career, and supporting employers to implement carer-friendly practices in the workplace.

As with every year, we hope to be able to grow our services and provide more opportunities for carers of all ages to access the support they need. The support of our dedicated Trustee Board, staff, volunteers, and funders are all crucial to ensuring the future success of the charity. We continue to review, plan, and implement new ways of working to ensure that we can meet the needs of carers in Northumberland in the future. **Debra Blakey - CEO**
