Many employers ask for online application forms to be filled in, rather than accepting a CV.

What information does an application form gather?

- An application form will ask for similar information from your CV
- An application form will likely ask: full name, National Insurance number, address, contact details, education history and job history



Use copy and paste to move information from your CV to the application form.



- Some job sites/employers may let you register an online
 account. This will let you come back and continue the form at a different time.
- An application form might ask for your suitability to the job (this could be between 300 2000 words
 depending on the role). Read the 'Supporting Statements' factsheet to help with this section of the form
- The form might ask detailed questions about your skill set read the 'Interview Skills' or 'Transferrable Skills' factsheet for support with this
- An application form may ask if you have any criminal convictions for more information about this, visit the GOV.uk website: www.gov.uk/tell-employer-or-college-about-criminal-record

References

- You may also need to provide at least two references. This will likely include a reference from your most recent employer
 - If you haven't got any recent work experience, a reference could be a teacher/college tutor, or an organisation where you've previously volunteered



Check that people are happy to act as your referee.



- Voluntary work can help you gain more skills, knowledge and to have a professional reference for when looking for employment
- · As a carer, it's important to be clear with your time commitment and your wellbeing
