Hi, I am Lucinda and am the SENDCO for LWOOSA/SOOSA. The following information is for parents/carers who feel they need additional support. I have twins, one who has ADHD and the other who has severe learning difficulties.

In this pack, I have included information on a number of organisations who provide support for SEND parents/carers, which I know would've been helpful when I was needing additional support. We provide nurturing care for all children and aim to tailor our care wherever possible.

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Incredible Kids are a charity based in Lockleaze at The Vench Adventure Playground. They run inclusive play sessions for children and young people aged 0-25 with additional needs, disabilities and support for families. Parents/carers and siblings are also welcome to attend. No diagnosis is required to attend, however pre-booking and membership is required. They welcome families from Bristol, South Gloucestershire and beyond.

Examples of sessions they provide include:

- Incredible Saturdays family play
- Incredible Fridays after-school family play session & a hot meal for children
- Quiet Sessions (Saturday mornings) limited spaces to provide quiet times
- Incredible girls I have personally used this service and would recommend it to families with SEND.

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Family Fund Helping disabled children

To apply for Family Fund, you must be a parent/carer of a children/children/young person aged between 0-24 who has a disability or serious illness that is not in foster care or under care of the Local Authority. Please see the "Are we eligible?" page on their website to check eligibility before applying. If successful in your application for the grant, Family Fund can supply family breaks/holidays, computers/tablets, clothing, kitchen appliances, sensory toys, games consoles, outdoor play equipment, days out, furniture/household, games/books/music, specialist trikes/bikes and clubs/hobbies/activities.
