A Message From Father Paul Abernathy

My Beloved Sisters and Brothers,

According to our Christian Church calendar...

November 1 is **All Saints' Day**; "saint" being a New Testament appellation for a Christian. On this day, we celebrate all the saints, those who have followed Jesus in ages past, in our current time, and in time to come, and...

November 2 is All Souls' Day, our annual commemoration of all the faithful departed or, in the words of the hymn,

For all the saints, who from their labors rest, who Thee, by faith, before the world confessed, Thy Name, O Jesus, be forever blessed.

Alleluia! Alleluia!

At Epiphany Church, per our annual custom, we will fold these two grand tributes into one. On Sunday, November 4, we will observe All Saints' Day. The Collect of the Day expresses well our intention:

Almighty God, who hast knit together thine elect in one communion and fellowship in the mystical body of thy Son Christ our Lord: Give us grace so to follow thy blessed saints in all virtuous and godly living, that we may come to those ineffable joys that thou hast prepared for those who unfeignedly love thee; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord, who with thee and the Holy Spirit liveth and reigneth, one God, in glory everlasting. Amen.

And during *The Prayers of the People*, we will recite the names of our loved ones who have died, who, in the faithfulness of our fondest memories ever abide with us as surely, we believe, they dwell eternally with God.

An Additional Message From Father Paul

John, the evangelist, in his gospel account of the life of Jesus, wrote near the end of the first century of the Common Era. At that time, the Jesus-movement began to be seen and understood as distinguished from (and, at times, in competition with and antagonistic to) Judaism. John, immersed in his time, oft used the phrase, "the Jews," to refer to the religious authorities who were opposed to Jesus. Sadly, through the centuries, many Christians have heard these references and, woefully mistakenly, have embraced them as an indictment of (and a justification for considering) Jews as "Christ-killers." In the light, verily, in the shadow of the historic denigration of Jews, including the Holocaust, horrifically recently manifested in the massacre of eleven of our Jewish sisters and brothers of the Tree of Life synagogue, Pittsburgh, PA, I, as your Priest-in-Charge, in the public reading of the Gospel of John, no longer will utter the words, "the Jews." I will replace them with "the people." In this small, yet significant step, I pray that we, in our public reading of scripture, will not fortify any false conception of Judaism or serve as any rationale, however subtle, for anti-Semitism.
